Old Business: The Baton Rouge Cruise was well attended. Fifteen or sixteen British cars and thirty or forty people took part at various stages. The first stop, the West Baton Rouge Museum in Port Allen was a pleasant surprise. Organizers Rick Huber, Bobby Spann, and Milton Franklin had not realized how much was in the museum and we spent a good bit longer there than expected. We were a little late to lunch at the Bayou Bistro in Brusly and even later to Nottoway. Bill Nix met us at Nottoway in his silver Jaguar Mark II and ended up waiting 45 minutes for us to arrive!

The North Shore meeting was well attended, as usual. They have had a speaker at every meeting for the last year. Bob Hurst talked at one meeting about his trip to the Hersey PA Swap meet. The event is on 150 acres and at the end of the day, Bob's wife asked him how far he thought they had walked. He guessed 2 miles. Her fitness tracker had logged NINE miles! The NS Cars & Coffee group meets every Saturday and currently alternates between two restaurants. They are considering adding a place in Slidell for one weekend per month. #### January 2020 General Meeting

Speaker: Rojer Jefferies did a presentation on how to order our custom logo shirts from Lands End.

Car Show: We still need chairs for several committees including the Queen's Tea. The show is coming up fast so please email Karen Murray to volunteer for something!!

Reports: The club had 175 members plus 4 more picked up during the meeting.

Speaker: Benny Stiegler have an interesting talk on history of the McLaren marque. BMCNO Mike Glore has one! Hopefully it will be at the show in March!

Projects: Mike Anderson visited his brother and helped him pull the gas tank on an a "gift" TR4. The fuel filter was clogged with fine rust, so they ordered and installed a tank sealer. Time with tell if it helps. They also pulled the front end off the his brother's TR3 (that used to be Mike's). All the bolts that escaped the TR3's numerous oil leaks were rusty and required a lot of gorilla work to remove. The ones under the leaks came right off!

Allen Bradley changed the rear shocks on his TR6. They are true lever action shocks and were no problem at all. Benny Stiegler wants to inspect his shocks before the Arkansas cruise this summer. He's not sure there is any oil in them. Allen says he used motorcycle fork oil in his.





Benny had been told hydraulic jack oil would work for much less. However, you don't need much so it's not a huge difference.

Keith Vezina has a 1950 MG-TD in his shop that had been sitting for years with a full tank of gas. The gas is "skunked" and had to be discarded. Keith pulled the tank and drained it, fixed the fuel leaks then took it to The Radiator Shop on Downman Rd. They boiled it out and lined it guaranteed not to separate - for \$200. They were very good about protecting the paint while they were working. The first few feet of fuel line leaving the tank were plugged solid with tar. Keith tried blowing it out but ended up using a heat gun to soften the tar then rodded it out with a coat hanger.

Keith did a couple of inspections recently. One was a classic Mini manufactured in 1999 and titled as a 1967 (with fuel injection and an ECM). The car originated in France and the speedometer is in KMPH. It's cool to cruise down the highway, legally, at "100"!!

Another inspection was an MGB with a supercharger that was in "Belle Chase". "It's not that far, just over the bridge" they said. Keith ended up 12 miles beyond the Naval Air Station!!

#### BMCNO 2019 Delgado Scholarship Receipents

The year was 2006 and it was BMCNO's eighteenth annual British Car Day. Five years prior, the club moved the show from LaFreniere Park in Metairie to Delgado Community College, City Park Campus.

For the past two previous years, BMCNO had donated the proceeds from the car show to Delgado, buying shop supplies, and replacing materials destroyed by Hurricane Katrina. However, from the very first year at Delgado, we wanted to give scholarships.

In 2008, we finally did it!! Karen Murray joined the board in 2007. Karen was employed by the Jefferson Parish School System, and worked with the Bonnebel High School automotive program and was coordinating with Delgado on many other issues. She knew what needed to be done and who to contact. Karen got the scholarship committee organized, coordinated things with Delgado, cracked the whip a few times and FINALLY got a BMCNO scholarship program created.



On Tuesday, February 26, 2008 club President Keith Vezina formally presented the first BMCNO scholarships to five Delgado automotive department students.

Since the first three scholarships' were awarded in 2008, BMCNO has awarded a total of 57

scholarships amounting to \$28,500.00.

#### History of the Triumph Spitfire

The Spitfire started with the Austin Healy Sprite. Around 5,000 Sprites were sold in the in the US but this was taking sales away from Triumph and MG. The Sprite was a quarter of the price of the MGA and TR3 so Triumph needed a cheap car that was better than the Sprite.

So Triumph started with the existing Herald chassis and engine and only made slight modifications, keeping the cost down. Giovanni Michelotti was pulled in to design the new body and

the resulting prototype project was named "The Bomb"! The car was to have many "modern" conveniences such as roll down windows, rubber floor mats, a heater and a locking trunk!! However, In 1960, Triumph was sold to British Leland and the "Bomb" project was forgotten.

Years later, British Leyland found the prototype and decided to build it. From 1962 to

1964 the Spitfire 4 (for 4-cylinder engine) sold 45,000 units at around \$12,000. Stories said the name was a tribute to the WWII fighter plane by the same name but there is no documentation to support that.

This model had issues with the rear wheel collapsing because of the way they narrowed the Herald chassis to fit the new body. (The problem would not be fixed fixed for eight years.) Hemings says the 24' 2" turning radius is the shortest of any car until the Smart Car which is 22.8'. They sold 46,000 Spitfires from 1962-1964 compared to 5,000 Sprites.

In 1964 improvements were made to the Sprite but not much. Then the Spitfire MkII was introduced and it had CARPET!! 37,000 of them were sold.


In 1968 the 100,000th car was built. 75% were exported, 45% to the USA.

The MkIII featured the raised bumper and a better soft top but the emission controls for North American export robbed power from the vehicle.

At this point the car still had the dash display in the middle so it was the same for left-hand and right-hand drive models.

In 1968, Triumph, BMG and British Leland merged.

In 1970 there was a redesign making the car very similar to the Stag and FINALLY fixing the rear wheel collapsing problem. Also, the dash display was moved to over the steering wheel (different for left-



and right-hand drive) and the heater became standard.

The 1500 was slower due to the emission controls and the black rubber bumper overriders were added to meet US safety requirements. On the good side the handling was improved.

In 1975, between the government bailout, US safety regulations and competition from the Japanese 240Z the production ceased.

In all, over 300,000 cars were built over 18 years. And every one has an "M" on the hood latch for "Michelotti".
