

Report From Track Side!!

Jim, Donna and Justin Clark were accompanied by Mark and Shannon Ferketish when attending the Sports Car Vintage Racing Association (SCVRA) on 15-16 October at the NOLA Motorsports Park New Orleans. The event was billed as Mardi Gras in October and proved an exciting weekend of racing and individual activities. We showed in time on Saturday to enter Jim's 1976 TR6 and Mark's 1986 Alfa Romeo Spider Veloce Quadrafoglio into a car show. The other cars entered were Corvettes, Mustangs, Cobras, and various muscle cars.

After situating the entries we walked over to the paddock behind the race car garages. The Jaguar Driving Team established a autocross track beginning with a short straightaway and many hairpin turns the first turn is figure 8 effect turn opening into another straightaway across the paddock. The big thrill is each of us was at the wheel accompanied by a professional driver. After completing the first run of the motocross track we changed cars from an S-Type Jag to the F-Type Jag and then drove the track again. We were flying on this closed-course-track enclosed in the power and luxury of the Jag sedan and coupe.

After this thrill we walked over to the all-terrain course and did some low speed laps in the brand





new Land Rover. The course demonstrated the handling, the comfort, and the agility of the Land Rover. Accompanied by another professional diver we climbed a short hill and looked into the blue sky and clouds as we pulled up this steep obstacle followed by a crawling descent. No foot on the brake at this obstacle. On the

No foot on the brake at this obstacle. On the straight away the LR moved confidently while tilted at 22 degree angle. Donna was at the wheel smiling all the time. The computer controls adjusted the vehicle traction brakes and power at every turn of the wheel. All of us received a black Jaguar / Land Rover Ball Cap for our efforts and skill.

Donna here...Spending the day behind the wheel of any vehicle other than the one I arrived in was quite a surprise. I had never driven a Jaguar and never autocross, but what a thrill. I will definitely do that again. Feeling confident with my newfound swagger, I was eager to jump into a Land Rover and take it for a different experience altogether. An audio/visual tech on the scene asked permission to film my drive and mic my experience as well. Sure, I said, why not. So first things first, how do I get into this large vehicle which rides high off the ground? My prodriver pushed a button and the Land Rover lowered for easy entry...sweet. After adjusting the seat, buckling up and a quick rundown of some of the awesome features, we were off. Slow and





steady just steer, the computer senses the terrain all the while adjusting accordingly. What do you need me for, I'm on three wheels and can't see a thing! I was careful to control my language (swearing), contain my excitement (anxiety), remembering I had a microphone on my every word (rapid breathing). This was crazy, but yet another thrill and our day had just begun.

The track racing was thrilling to watch from our vantage point seats above the final turn we watched as the racers accelerated out into the 5,200' straight away. What excitement!! Two cars spun out on different laps, a BMW sliding into the infield and a Corvette sliding into the retaining wall by pit row and breaking the body





in two pieces. No one was hurt in the crash but later as we walked through the other paddock area we saw the damage to the Corvette was extensive. Jim captured some great images

Jim here, One of the great thing about this event is the access allowed, as we strolled through the pit and paddock areas our attention was drawn from one attraction to another. The front row was a line of car transporters, cars stored on the upper level or sitting on the elevators while crews scurried around in the garages below. Large tents shielded the cars from the sun as teams made final adjustments. The back row consisted of weekend warriors in smaller motorhomes acting as their own crew, and driver. We spoke with many of the owners and crews', without exception, they took time to engage in conversation and answer our questions. A driver and a mechanic who were preparing a Austin Healey Sprite to run on the track took time to "heat cycle" the 185 HP engine for our enjoyment. The owner giving full credit to his mechanic for the powerful sounding engine. The mechanic sharing his tip on how to oil the shafts of the SU carburetors by drilling a oiling hole in the bushing to keep them from wearing. Moving on we next encountered another driver who informed us that the most dangerous thing on the track are the golf carts which seem to run at





random angles all over the pit area oblivious to the high powered race cars moving to the staging area. As the driver exited from his golf cart to start his Chevron B19 we ask about the race prepared Alfa Romeo Giulia Spider Veloce next to his CAR, his answer was "oh that is my wife's" as he rumbled off to staging. His wife popped out of their RV and headed for her car and was off to staging giving a big wave. I believe she beat her husband in their class. The longevity award goes to Talbot Lee, 86 years who was driving a 967 Ginetta G4, which took 5 people and one minor injury to push start. He was leading his class until he threw a fan belt, not bad for a 86 year old driver and 70 years of racing experience. I still have a chance.

On Sunday the crowd and racing contestants thinned and now we had the opportunity for a



hot-lap riding again with professional drivers in the Jags on the main track of the Motor Speedway NOLA main track. After we "suited" up in our helmets and knit liner we enjoyed the sheer power and acceleration of the Jags. From a full stop in the covered pit area the professions driver merged into the straightaway and in my case announced 145 mph as he slid the car into the first of many turns steering to the right off the right and decelerating. This is the fastest I have ever traveled on a ground. We entered the series of turns at 120 mph and my face felt the G-forces.

Jim, here, Hot laps what a great time. Donna, Justin and I were fortunate enough to enjoy the complimentary hot lap in a F-Type provided by Jaguar. We were issued helmets and lined up for our ride. I hopped into the F-Type to look over seeing the Pro Drive was a young Female, not the time to make jokes about female drivers. She asked how I felt about speed and I replied go for it. It was a wonderful experience, she called out speeds as we entered turns at a 145 MPH then she would say I am going to break the rear loose, ok? Sure!! She was an accomplished driver handling a very polished car. The experience was surreal as I chatted with her on the course about her family, she was 26 and had been a nationally ranked water skier. She had found a new love in driving high performance cars. I was amazed at the handling and performance of the F-Type powering around the track flying into turns. The more impressive fact is that this was achieved with the AC on full blast.

Justin, here, experiencing the hot lap with a professional race driver was like nothing I had ever experienced before. The Jaguar F-Type, from a passenger's perspective at least, seemed to be effortlessly dancing around the track and sliding around corners. This was even more incredible as the driver shouted out that we had entered







the first turn going 145 MPH. The only item that managed to outshine the car was the driver. It is hard to comprehend how someone can be driving a car to the absolute limits and still be able



to maintain a conversation as if they were sitting in a parking lot. The driver casually informed me that he had been a professional racer for ten years and that driving an F-Type on a closed track all day never stopped being fun. Needless to say I asked him what career changes I needed to make to end up in his position.

The fun continued when we made four laps parade style on the main track driving our own cars. Jim in the TR6, Justin and Donna in his BMW roadster, and Shannon and I in the Alfa.

What excitement taking four laps with about eight other drivers in their cars with the pace cars leading and tailing our ever faster parade around the track. I know I got the Alfa up above 95 mph on the straight away before I decelerated into the right turn... enough speed for Shannon and I with the top down. In the corners it was a smooth downshift and accelerate through the sweet spot of each turn. What A thrill!!

Jim here, I was thrilled to be on the track at NOLA MOTORSPORTS. I was sure to be the last car in line, the pace car behind me. I love my TR6 but I know it is no match for the field of cars that were allowed to do not 1 but 4 parade laps. As each lap was completed the line of cars increased speed, I was soon in my own Mitty Experience, surely providing much entertainment for the prodrive in the F-Type Pace Car behind me. Trying to figure out how to enter and exit turns and general just having a wonderful time. All too soon we had to exit the track. My next stop was the gift shop to purchase a track decal to affix to my TR 6 windshield to prominently display that she had made it onto at least one race course, hoping it is not the last.

Of course the real winner here was Mark.



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
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Calling all British Motorcycle Owners

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
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
