Old Business:

Rick Huber reported on the Baton Rouge group. Another tech session was planned to work on flooded cars. Euro-Fest in Natchez was a lot of fun, as was the Pan-

handle British Car Association (Pensacola) show.

New Business: The office of vice-president is open. Jim Clark had to resign due to work demands. Please consider stepping up. Monthly board meetings are held on the NO South Shore but we have Skype for remote attendees.

Plans for the Busted Wrench cruise to Gulfport and other upcoming events were discussed.

Jim Clark is scheduled to speak on Garage Safety at the May meeting.

Car Show: The bad thing about the show was the weather, with intermittent pouring rain. However, the good thing was everyone's attitudes. Everyone made a point of enjoying what they could!

Suggestions for the next show were discussed. (Remember, not all will be adopted.)

Cut down on the number of raffle and auction items. Announcing the winners took a long time. The auction and raffle made roughly \$1,000 but there were a lot of duplicate items.

Post all door prize names and raffle ticket winners rather than announcing them. Ticket holders can come and check for their names.

Some sort of permanent solution for the class letters is needed. The paper class signs either melted or blew off the wooden sandwich boards. Discontinue the Goody Bag Party. Rather than make it a general club event, have the committee chair arrange a small group of volunteers to stuff the bags and the registrar arrange for a group to create the pre-registration packets.

Do not print photos. Next year we will post the images to the website for download.

Present ribbons for 2nd and 3rd place to save on trophies. Several people objected strenuously but others said they did not want trophies except for 1st place.

Have a prepared description of the Elliott Evans award for the announcer to read and not impose on the award's sponsor for a description.

Cut out regalia sales. It is a lot of work to unload merchandize, set up to sell, pack up and reload on the truck, then off-load and store unsold merchandise until the next year. However, regalia sales were around \$1,000.

Cut out the Ladies' Tea. The ladies were against it. It is a lot of work but the folks who do the work enjoy it.

Reports: At the time of the meeting, BMCNO had 170 members. The car show ended with 101 cars registered and 76 on the field.

Projects: Bob Klare recently got to drive his Mini Cooper on the track at NOLA Motorsports. On the 4th session, the tread tore off both front tires and he had to be towed home. Bob confessed to some "aggressive" driving!

The cost of the event is offset by the club, therefore anyone other than your one guest will be charged \$20.00.



having her two children, Cody worked in the



Cultural Arts and Events Department of the City of Covington for two years.

In her new role as Covington Celtic Club president, Cody succeeded in bringing a familyfriendly St. Patrick's Day to the North Shore. She got plenty of input from Nick, whom she met in high school when he went to St. Paul's. The two went to LSU before getting married and moving to the Lower Garden District.

Living there as well as delving into Nick's family history gave the two plenty of thoughts for the Covington St. Patrick's Day celebration. Nick's great-grandfather John J. Sheahan was the New York City St. Patrick's Day Parade chairman from 1939-1958.

The New York City St. Patrick's Day parade is the oldest, founded by Irish soldiers in the British army in 1762-- 14 years before New York signed the Declaration of Independence.

The Ludwigs learned a lot from looking at Nick's grandfather's scrapbooks.

"We had the privilege of looking through all of his memorabilia and really seeing how awesome of a NYC figure he was. There were parade pamphlets, letters and photos from President Harry Truman, a thank you note from Jacqueline Kennedy from flowers that were sent after JFK's assassination... it was incredible," Cody said. "My mother-in-law Eileen Ludwig's diligence in keeping everything in memory books

and labeled helped us to really research for our parade."

Reaching out to first responders is key to the New York parade and something Cody thought would work in Covington.

"That's how I knew things like involving our local fire department at the front of the parade and to make sure I tracked down some Irish wolfhounds, an apparent staple in any legitimate St. Patrick's parade according to the president of the Irish Wolfhound Club of America," she said.

Their vision came together on March 11. The parade started on Columbia Street in front of the Columbia Street Tap Room at noon.

Flag bearers and community leaders Glyn Bailey, Tim Lantrip from the English Tea Room, artist Robert Dutruch and musician Greyhawk Perkins led the parade. Covington Mayor Mike Cooper and the petite bearers announced the parade with a large banner.

Cooper and company were followed by the lilting sounds of Kilts of Many Colors bagpipe marching band from Abita Springs.

Grand Marshal food critic Tom Fitzmorris was next. He had a great time flinging beads from his convertible. Fitzmorris was escorted by a member of the Daughters of the British Empire and a member of the British Motoring Club of New Orleans.

While British classic cars rolled along, Irish wolfhounds walked in step. The Covington Fire Department marched in kilts and green and orange T-shirts.

Even the St. Paul's Band got into the spirit, attempting an Irish jig while they played. A bevy of beautiful young colleens threw beads from a very green float.

The McElroy Irish Dance Academy, marched in the parade, occasionally stopping long enough to perform an entire dance. The ladies and gentlemen of the Celtic Club presented paper roses, badges and throws to people along the way.

An original entry to the parade was the Covington Bicycle Club that walked or glided the route on decorated bikes. Along the route, parade watchers staked out watching spots at local restaurants like the patio at Meribo and the front of the English Tea Room.

Some lucky Covingtonians like Chelsea Wagner, Claire Minge, Jeri Creson and Michaela Minge even watched the parade from their own or a friend's porch.

The parade ended at Jewel's Cigar & Briar shop at Rutland and New Hampshire, where the block party began.

The St. Kilda Celtic Band began at 1 p.m., followed by Kilts of Many Colors. The Northlake Performing Arts Society performed various Irish songs and folk songs. The Abita Blues Band closed the block party at 5 p.m.

It was so much green fun, I'll be there next year too.




