I found out that they'd be passing through Vicksburg and Shreveport, and they'd be happy for people to join them for just a leg or two of the trip. At the present time I happen to be short one MGB to make the trip, so I asked my brother Mark if he'd like to go in his 66 B, "Della". His reply was an enthusiastic yes, I guess he's thought about such an adventure before too.

So I registered and got on the email communication with Dick & PJ and kept up with the planning phase. They're taking a 10 day trip starting on June 16 to Savanna and making stops in Montgomery, Vicksburg, Shreveport, Waco, Carlsbad, Las Cruces, Phoenix, Yuma, and final-

Iy into San Diego. Like the adventure plan, Mark and I made a plan to drive on two lane roads as much as possible from Baton Rouge to Vicksburg



on June 18, travel with the cross country caravan on the 19th, and then drive back to Baton Rouge on La 1 on the 20th. A 603 mile journey over three days.

I called John Turbeville and Pat Cashman the Wednesday before to see if they'd like to have some folks from EMC MS join the group in Vicksburg, and it turns out that Pat had already been in touch with Dick and had offered to host a get together at his garage in the afternoon. Dick's 78 MGB was on the trailer, and he was ready to swap and drive it in case somebody else broke down and had to be towed. Great idea! PJ had made the cross country trip in his V-6 MGB GT a dozen or so times

over the years, so he had the navigation/ communication/ planning seat in the Tahoe. His wife was flying to San Diego to meet him. Roger and Shirley Gabbert were in their 70 MGB. They had driven to Savanna from Chicago to join the cross country adventure. This will be their 26th NAMGBR convention, the only one they missed was due to a death in the family while on their way to Reno a few years ago. Talk about dedicated. They said there are only 2 other couples who have made all of the meets at locations all around the country. Terry & Mary Ellen McClain were from North Carolina, and were driving a factory original, 60,000 mile 74 MGB GT V8. Terry wanted one for many years, and when they turned 25 years old in 1990 (no longer had to meet US safety/emission requirements), he went to England while Mary Ellen was on a business trip, found and bought the car, and shipped it back home. That was only the second original V8 car I have seen, only 2,591 produced and none originally exported to the US. Very nice car. Mike and Sue Cook from Atlanta some of you might have met at the Pensacola show. They're driving the "Silver Lady", a restomod 77 MGB that Mike has put together with 4.6L Rover V8 engine, chrome bumpers, flared fenders and many other personalizations (but no A/C!). The last couple in the group was Larry & Gail Norton, also from Atlanta driving a 73 MGB. Larry is the current secretary of the NAMGBR and I believe they have been to the Pensacola show in the past. Like I said, what a group!

We all introduced ourselves, mingled for awhile, looked at cars, ate more snacks, and then Dick Lunney gave a little talk (picture) about the trip and thanked Pat & Barbara and the Mississippi club for the wonderful welcome party. Then we took a few pictures and headed back to the hotel. We sat around a big table and talked cars and adventures for a couple more hours before calling it a night.

A late start on Monday morning, the group wanted to go to the Vicksburg National Military Park, which was right across the street and didn't open until 9. I had been when the BMCNO went to Vicksburg a few years ago, but Mark was eager to see it too. We watched the film, drove around the battlefield looking at monuments, and stopped at the USS Cairo display. It's amazing that they built and ran those ships in the 1860s, a really impressive display. The row of MGBs looked great in the parking lot from the ship. At about



11, we saddled up, and headed out of the park, across the river, onto US Hwy 80, and on to Monroe for a lunch date at Big Moma's.

Funny thing about US 80 across Louisiana. When you ask Googlemaps to give you an "avoid highways" route between Vicksburg and Shreveport, it takes you 20 or 30 miles north or south of I-20 even though US 80 runs parallel to it just a mile or two away. Now I think I know why. US 80, despite the "La Highways and Byways" tourist signs, the way Mark put it is "undisturbed by regular maintenance for 50 years." It was bad, I was embarrassed that all of our visitors got to experience some of the billions of dollars of infrastructure repair backlog in Louisiana. I guess the roads along Interstates are low on the priority list. We bumped and bounced on 80 to Monroe, but then gave it up and took I-20 from there to Shreveport.

Big Moma's was a little hole in the wall restaurant, not sure how PJ came up with it, but the buffet style home cooking was quite good. Their


specialty was something I had never heard of, hot water cornbread. The chef came out and explained to us how it was made, and PJ recorded the description and texted the video to all of us. Everybody ate too much, and we were wishing for a nap instead of another hour and a half drive to Shreveport on I-20.

We got to the hotel about 3, and the nap was still calling. Another couple, Elvin and Janet Harris, joined us from Michigan, driving their 80 MGB with a Bimini top and a back-half-of-an-MGB trailer like Keith's. Everybody urged us to continue on to Waco the next day, but we had to get back. We sure did enjoy getting to know all these MGB die hards and we're already thinking about Gettysburg next June, but it was time for us to head home.

Tuesday was a 7 am departure. We said our good byes and wished everyone a safe journey to San Diego. They all wished us a safe and dry journey back to Baton Rouge, with any luck getting home before Tropical Storm Cindy ar-

rived. We forgot to get gas right there at the hotel, but we figured we would find plenty of stations along La 1. That was not the case. Despite intersections and town names along the road on the map, most of the towns were a couple of buildings and no gas stations. That's probably because I-49 was just a few miles to the west, and if we had really needed gas, we would have diverted over there to get it. However, the 50 or so miles of La 1 from Shreveport and Natchitoches must be about the least populated, least travelled in the entire state. But it sure was a nice road and morning to be out in a top down MGB. The temperature was in the high 70's, intermittent sun and clouds, and a little two lane road through the Louisiana countryside -We drove through Alexanpriceless. dria, Marksville, Simmesport, across the Morganza spillway, and on in to New Roads. From there we jumped over on to River Road for the last 15 or 20 miles to Baton Rouge and Mark did some spirited driving on the curves. It started sprinkling just as we turned onto my street, so we ducked under the next door neighbor's car port to put up the top, unloaded my stuff, and had some lunch.

So we had a great trip. Della ran and drove great. Everybody we met was friendly, talkative, and fun to be around. And super dedicated to the little British car hobby. What a great adventure. I think we'll probably try it again before too long. Cheers, Rick

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
