August 29th South Shore Meeting Minutes continued...

Reports: The club has 156 members.

Projects: Keith Vezina has a client bringing in a 2002 Morgan +8 for a checkup. Keith is grateful it's not a propane engine!!

On the trip to Key West, Keith learned the brake lights on his trailer were very dim, almost the same color as the running lights. He has replaced them with LEDs. He recommends 1156 and 1157 LED bulbs the same color as the lens. If you put a white light behind a red lens it looks pink. Also, go with a quality bulb from a good company. He has bought from SuperBrightLEDs.COM for around \$15 a bulb. You will have to change out some of the control components to solid state to make them work. He spent \$200 on the trailer lights but they are MUCH brighter (safer!!) and he will never have to change a bulb again, baring physical damage.

We've all heard Tom McMillan's "\$25 part causing a total re-build" story. Tom got tired of working on the front of the car so he's switched to the back. To save some money, Tom called his insurance company and had them remove the collision insurance since the car is off the road. Be sure

not to drop the liability – it might cause problems with your registration.

Mike Anderson has most of the Ginnetta's body work complete and is almost ready to paint. He's currently looking for a tie rod end.

Rick Huber recently purchased a new wiring harness for the 62 Austin Healey from <u>AutoSparks</u> <u>LTD</u> in the UK for \$600. <u>Rhode Island Wiring Services</u> in the US wanted MUCH more. Also, <u>AutoSparks does "bespoke" harnesses and they will modify a wiring harness to meet Concours d'Elegance guidelines.</u>

Keith Vezina keeps an old wiring harness in his shop for parts. You can't just buy a "purple with yellow stripe" wire. And if you could, you'd have to buy a roll when you only need 12 inches. He has a bullet connector crimp tool so he can patch a wire then crimp on the connector. Keith advises to NOT buy soldered connectors. The solder frequently breaks when you crimp the connector onto the wire.

Mold Control for cars in storage, by Fred Duplechin



Some of you are likely to have cars with leather interiors and are dismayed by how well mold grows on those surfaces in South Louisiana. EVERYTHING grows well here and that's a good thing for farmers, not so much for

car owners. I keep my old cars in a metal building that is not climate controlled. I've struggled with keeping those leather surfaces nice and usually the mold grows faster than I can clean. I suppose too, that once the mold gets a foothold on your leather, the microscopic spores remain no matter how well you clean, and the mold just grows back. I've come up with a 3 step plan that, while not a cure, helps me stay slightly ahead of this problem.

First, clean <u>all</u> the surfaces in the car with your favorite, "safe on leather," mild cleaning product, trying to remove the mold and spores. Then you need to suppress growth of mold without damaging the leather. I'm no chemist and you'll have to decide yourself what is the best "suppressor," but I did not want to use a product containing bleach. I use CLR Mold and Mildew Foaming Action Stain Remover. This product is easy to find (supermarket), bleach free and, even though it's sold as a "stain remover," it seems to do a good job of suppressing new mold growth.

Next, condition the leather with your favorite product that's made specifically for cars. I like Lexol. It's an old product, proven itself over time and is pretty easy to find at discount or auto parts stores. I don't think the leather conditioner brand makes much difference.

Finally, I hold down the humidity with a desiccant. I like DampRid in the hanging bags. It comes in smaller tubs also. Just hang the bag from the rearview mirror or set the tub on the console. The desiccant is in the upper half the bag/tub, and the moisture collects in the bottom. When you see that the desiccant is used up, change it out. The containers are "dump proof." You'll be surprised how much moisture it'll absorb in a week, then it'll settle down to where you change the bag every 2-3 months, depending on your location, how "closed" the car is, how damp your storage is, etc. The cheapest place I've found it (half the price of WalMart) is Dollar General – currently \$3.50 for the bags, \$2.50 for the tubs. I hope this helps. Good luck!

The Cypress Sawmill Collection documents the history of the cypress lumber industry in Louisi-








