Wedell-Williams Aviation and Cypress Sawmill Museum

On Saturday, September 29, twenty two BMCNO members met up at the Wedell Williams Aviation and Cypress Sawmill Museum in Patterson, LA.

South Shore members met at Krispy Kreme on Clearview Parkway for breakfast, and then convoyed to the museum.

The weather was nice with no rain or breakdowns. Other members met at the museum.

We all watched videos on aviation and cypress lumber cutting. The dual focus of this museum site highlights two very distinct—and compelling—aspects of Louisiana's rich history.



The Wedell-Williams Aviation Collection highlights the legacy of Louisiana aviation pioneers Jimmie Wedell and Harry P. Williams. Both men became nationally prominent during the Golden



Age of Aviation. Although both Wedell and Williams perished in plane crashes, their legacy lives on in the memorabilia and planes on display in this collection.

Exhibits - The Golden Age of Aviation

This exhibition celebrates the legacy of aviation pioneers Jimmie Wedell and Harry P. Williams, who formed an air service in Patterson in 1928 that quickly rose to the top tier of air racing. Displays include numerous replica aircraft, such as the famous Miss Patterson #44 and the Gilmore #121, race trophies and memorabilia. A surround -theater features an exciting air racing film that visually transports you to the heart of the 1932 Cleveland National Air Races with high-tech animation, sound, and wind effects.













Patterson Cypress Sawmill

Discover Louisiana's cypress lumber industry of the late 19th and 20th centuries. Patterson was the industry's heart, with the largest cypress sawmill in the world at the Frank B. Williams Cypress Company. This exhibit features a variety of artifacts—including an 1890 passe-partout, or crosscut saw—, photographs, and film that tell the story of this major historical enterprise.

The museum also hosts changing exhibits that highlight other aspects of Louisiana's culture and history. Gallery guides and age appropriate scavenger hunts are available for the permanent exhibits at this museum.





The Cypress Sawmill Collection documents the history of the cypress lumber industry in Louisiana. **Lumbering became the state's first significant** manufacturing industry. As a result, cypress lumber harvested and milled in Louisiana was shipped in mass quantities throughout the U.S. In 1997, the Louisiana State Legislature designated Patterson as the cypress capital of Louisiana.

After visiting the museum we then proceeded to the Atchafalaya Idelwild Golf Course Country Club for a delicious lunch.




