TECH TIPS MGB RUST PREVENTION by Michael Delacerda

The MGB's front fenders tend to rust out at the bottom, due to an accumulation of dirt and moisture. A little preventive maintenance in this area can help you save your car from needing major repairs later.

First remove the three phillips head screws at the bottom of the front fender. Then, carefully pull the bottom of the fender away from the car. Now scrape behind the fender bottom using a wide putty knife or similar object.(I used a ruler) You will be surprised at how much dirt falls out, and how wet it is!! Once the area is cleaned out, it can be treated with a rust killer and then painted to seal the metal.
