TECHNICAL TIPS

If your brake pressure failure switch assembly gives you trouble or leaks hydraulic fluid, then here is a fix. The MGB assembly may be dismantled easily and the two o-rings renewed. This fix cost 50¢ and is a pain to do, but then we do need good brakes.

Have you considered silicone brake fluid? If you have, then be prepared for a brake overhaul. All rubber parts should be renewed or cleaned with soap and water. Pump a quart of denatured alcohol to clean out the master cylinder and brake lines. Check the calliper pistons for cracks and chips in the chrome coating. Don't use a steel hammer to drive them back in. Use your vise to press them in. The biggest advantages of silicone fluid are that it doesn't absorb moisture and it doesn't eat paint. I sprayed some all over my car and all I had to do was wipe it off. Great!

Installation of new upholstery seat kits is quite a chore. It would take pages to describe this. For help on this see Jimmy Bruno.
