

#### IN MY TRAVELS by Jim Jones

I have been trying to locate the source of a clucking sound in my MG 1100 for awhile now. The car made so many noises when I got it that this noise was minor at the time. The transmission was trashed, so I rebuilt it and the differential and replaced the inboard U-joints with the original type. Boy, did a lot of noises disappear after that.

Next, I replaced all the motor mounts and the mounts which attach the front sub-frame to the body of the car. None of the mounts were separated, but a couple were close to being so. I can't say that any noises went away after this, but some of the remaining ones did tone down by 1db or so. (Small engines with 114,000 miles on them tend to produce some noises.) I also have replaced front bearings, lower suspension rubber bushes, and rebuilt the upper and lower ball joints. This produced a smoother ride, but no real noise reduction.

I had a banging sound that was louder inside the car than it was outside of the car. I was told that because the steering rack is attached to the vertical portion of the floor pan and not to the frame, as in most cars, that any noise coming from the steering rack is amplified inside the car. Well, you know what I did next. Rebuilding the rack assembly was not hard. Except for the bush part. The original was not available, but the supplier told me that the felt bush used in the lower part of the steering post would due just fine. I ordered two from him, one for steering post also. Installing the felt bush proved to be difficult. It looked like a pretty tight fit, so I choose not to pre-lube it. Good thing, it was hard enough to insert in it's mounting three inches deep into the rack housing without it being swollen with oil. The felt bush is thick and flat. It must be made into a round tube and it does not want to be round! After I finally got it in place, and had to drive the rack through it, lightly oiled, with a piece of hard wood and a hammer. I taped up one end of the rack housing and placed it in a vice with the open end up. I filled the housing with the proper lube and let the felt bushing soak up oil over night. The next day I reassembled the unit and although stiff, it did turn easy enough with the steering post and the steering wheel attached. I figured that the felt bush would "wear in". Well, the steering is a lot lighter now after use, but now the rack makes a groaning sound. I think that the substitute felt bush was a little too thick.

My rattling sound was not in the steering rack, but the rebuilding of the rack did eliminate the banging sound inside of the car. One more mystery noise disappeared.

I am getting close to installing a larger rebuilt engine (from 1098cc to 1275cc), transmission, and differential in my MG 1100. Maybe, I will find the source of the noise while doing so.

The engine from a '71 Austin America has been bored to .020", will have new pistons with a shallower dish tops, and will have the MG dual carb set up installed. The newer transmission will afford me a synchronized first gear and a reverse light switch (Backing out of Cliff Hughes' long, curving, dark driveway is murder without reverse lights).

At Mike Schrantz's place on Saturday the 8th, Peter, Mike, and myself were able to install the dual overhead cam six cylinder engine in Mike's '64 Jaguar MK II. Afterwards, we installed the rebuilt front suspension unit. What a day of accomplishment. Getting the engine back in a car and getting the car back on all four wheels is always a big day when a car is being restored.

Under the heading of "You never know what you will find next", Peter and I began to disassemble the car's steering post for replacement of the upper and lower bushes We found that the bushes had already been replaced, but with wraps of a towel and some cloth soaked in oil! This job was a temporary fix at best. We will replace the bushes later on with the proper replacement bushes made of black nylon material.




