February 20 Minutes

The meeting was called to order by club president Charlie Ake at 7:40 p.m. New member Tilden Holiday was present.



Wheel Bearing Play by Jim Jones

I have changed many a front wheel bearing set without any real problems. However, I did experienced a problem recently. I had changed out the bearings in a MG Midget disk wheel front hub and noticed that the inner bearing went in place very easily. The bearing did not need to be pressed into position. I could simply seat the bearing using my fingers. I knew that this was not the norm, but I did not pay too much attention to it at the time.



I mounted the hub on the front spindle shaft only to find that the hub had way too much movement at the inner bearing. I removed the hub and checked the placement of the components only to find that everything was O.K. I selected another hub assembly into which the inner bearing had to be pressed into place. I mounted it and found no play at either the inner or outer bearings.

I inspected the faulty hub and could not find any cracks. The hub's inner bearing seat must have been stretched. The car from which I had obtained this hub had suffered a front tire blow out. The stresses placed on the hub during the blow out must have stretched the hub at the inner bearing seat.

If you have experienced a blow out or have hit a curb hard, check the play in the front or rear hubs. If excessive, the hub may be at fault and not the bearings. Although, I would replace the bearings anyway.

It looks like I will have to find another Midget disk wheel front hub. Anybody have one available?

A Trick of the Trade by Mr. Goodspanner

While listening to the Saturday "Car Talk" radio show on PBS "with Click and Clack the tappet brothers" I heard of a trick that was a new one to me. A 30 year plus heavy equipment mechanic related a technique that he has utilized.

Many times a part removal requires that the oil in an engine or the fluid in a hydraulic system be drained first. In order to not perform this task, he uses a shop vacuum. Using a number of home made adapters, he connects the vac to the system and it prevents the oil or fluid from leaking out while he removes the part. He adjusts the vacuum to prevent it from withdrawing fluid.

He claims that it works like a dream and has save him much time. He has only had a problem one time. While using this technique one day, he had just removed an oil drain plug from the oil pan of a large piece of equipment when a fellow employee turned off the vac to tell him that it was lunch time. Ten gallons of oil poured down on him!


