'Haunted' Drive Through History


When: Saturday, May 18th





Other significant features of the TR Registry include the documenting of Stolen or For-Sale cars, an online registration Certificate and Photo Gallery. The TR Registry is not directly affiliated with any one company or club, but rather (we hope) supported by all vendors and clubs who are serious about the preservation and documentation of the TR automobiles. Development continues, as over the next few weeks our plans are to include the TR2/3/4 models. Further design and functionality are presently underway, having listened to your requests, and recognizing both clubs & individuals needs alike. Further announcements will be made.


