### Transporter Nightmare by Jim Jones

This article is not about British cars per say. It is about the trailers that are sometimes used to transport them around and about.

I have owned my flat bed trailer for a few years now and the tires were used when I purchased the trailer as new. The depth of the threads on the tires was O.K., but the surfaces of the tires were cracked and dried out. So, I decided to replaced them with



new tires. No big deal, I thought. I jacked up the trailer, placed jack stands under its frame, and proceeded to removed the lug nuts. That's where the problems popped up!

As usual the guys that mounted the rims used too much force to install the lug nuts and installed them over heavily painted studs. Despite the fact that I had an electric torque wrench tool available to me, a good third of the lug nuts refused to budge. After the liberal used of much penetrating oil and a lot of banging, I was finally able to removed all the lug nuts.

However, one wrong procedure created other problems. The studs and the nuts had been over stressed. I had to "wire wheel" the studs (all twenty of them), clean off all paint and run a die over them. Next, I had to tap out the nuts.

If I had had a flat on the road, I would never have been able to remove some of the lug nuts. Not even with my large cross-type lug nut tool.

On top of all that, turns out that the tires mounted on the trailer rims were not "trailer" type tires either, but of the normal "automotive" type.

The lesson to be learned here is that, if you own a car transporter, you should remove the tire/rim assemblies and check everything out before you are caught on the side of the road by lug nuts that you cannot remove. §

### "So Long" from Rudi Markl


