Nagivator - Driving through a slalom course. The driver has a bag over his/her head, and the navigator guides by instruction.

Rope Hold - The goal is to drive both forward and backward in a circle around a pot with a rope attached. Pulling the rope out results in penalty points.

Flag Pull & Ball Drop - Both driver and navigator participate pulling a flag from a cone and replacing it with a small ball.

Tire Roll - Roll a tire (in this case a Mini tire) around a Lotus.

Wall Stop - Seeing how close one can come to a wall without breaking the egg taped to the front bumper.


