



## Pensacola Beach Bash Car Show by Cathy Greensfelder

The Panhandle British Car Association held their 13th Annual Pensacola Beach Bash Car Show on Saturday, April 16th. The Friday convoy was sort of disorganized this year. Several of the regular Friday drivers were unable to go and several others had to work Friday morning so only three cars, Susan & Allen Bradley in their TR6, Bill Breithoff in his TR8 and Cathy and Mark Greensfelder in our MGB, left at 2:30 pm. Somewhere in Mississippi Cathy started smelling something sweet and burnt. Like coolant. Just as Cathy said she smelled coolant, Mark said the car was running really hot. They headed for the shoulder, followed by the two Triumphs. As the MGB slowed, steam was visible coming from under the bonnet. The temperature probe in the back of the radiator had popped half way out and steam and coolant were spraying all over the engine compartment. Not good!

Allen inspected the problem and Susan and Cathy began gathering up all the little half liters of bottled water from our coolers, while Bill Breithoff scavenged something off the side of the road to hold the probe in the radiator. We arrived late for the reception at the host hotel, the Best Western. The weather was absolutely perfect - it was warm but not hot, sunny, breezy... a glorious day! There were just under 100 cars registered including 17 cars entered by BMCNO members. Due to damage by Hurricane Ivan, the location on the public parking lot where the show is usually held was unavailable. Pensacola Beach officials were just not able to give up a substantial portion of what little parking lot had been restored. So the show was held in the parking lot of the Hampton Inn Hotel. The Hampton is about half way between the "Beach Ball Water Tower" and the host hotel. Since the Hampton will not be open for guests for several more months, they were able to spare their lot! The location *did* cut way down on the number of spectators. At the regular location, they always got hundreds of beach-goers walking through the show on the way to or from their own cars. But other than that, the location was just fine.

BMCNO came home with 14 trophies. Paul Read won a die-cast Mini Cooper and a \$50 Gift Certificate in the raffle and Cathy Greensfelder received the hard luck award for her radiator incident. When Cathy pointed out that Bill also deserved an award for "most creative use of lumber in an automotive repair", he was awarded an MGB owner's manual for his wife Sally's MGB. §
