

#### **NAMGBR 2005 Convention**

After 4 and ½ days of driving, and bypassing tornadoes, high wind and hail in Oklahoma and Kansas, we finally reached the Red Lion Hotel in Olympia, Washington. This was the site of the 2005 NAMGBR 2005 Convention and the fourth NAMGBR convention that we have attended. We were one of several MGs that arrived early for the four-day convention, but it worked out well: it gave us a chance to clean the MG of road dirt and grime.



The following day a group of about two dozen or so MGs set out for Mt. St. Helens. After about an hour's drive through the scenic backroads, we reached the parking lot at the National Park's Visitor Center. The views were breathtaking. It's hard to believe that it has been 25 years since the eruption and the damage is still evident. Downed trees, rock and evidence of mudslides were everywhere. We even saw Mt. Rainier in the distance.

The following day, instead of attending the tech sessions or a tour of the LeMay Car Collection, we decided to set out on our own and took a ride to the Pacific Ocean. By the time we started out it was raining. In fact, it rained the whole trip. The rain didn't matter because the scenery was well worth it.

The third day, under beautiful skies, we took a ride to a Native American reservation and were served a bar-b-que that featured fresh-caught salmon. After dinner and entertainment, we were invited to see the Cultural Center and got a history lesson of the Northwest Native Americans. Then it was back to the hotel to clean the car again.



Saturday morning, the day of the show, the parking lot of the hotel was filled with MGs. The show was held there because the grass being too soggy from the rain.

The show had 178 entries and was divided into 20 classes. This year, instead of entering the "Popular Choice", we decided to try "Concours d'Elegance" just to experience it and to see how the judging was done. It takes six judges and about one and a half hours to go through the judging sheets for the nine cars that were judged. Fourteen cars were registered, but six decided not to participate.

MG Driver Magazine and in Classic MG Magazine.





It was strange seeing others taking group pictures in front of our car. Just never thought of it that way.

The day after the show, and after saying our good byes, we hit the road for the long trip home. We made it even longer by touring Yellowstone Park (Old Faithful), Devil's Tower, Crazy Horse National Monument, Mt. Rushmore and The Badlands National Park.

The total trip was 6,100 miles long and took us 13 days to complete. We ended up going through twelve states, seven of which I had never been through. It was a once in a lifetime opportunity that we are glad we took. Winning the "Concours" and receiving the Ron Tugman Memorial Award made the trip even more special.

The MG 2006 will be held in Gatlinburg, Tennessee on June 21-25, 2006. This event is put on every five years by all of the North American MG Registers. There will be five host hotels, all within walking distance of each other. The Great Smoky Mountains National Park has some fantastic MG roads, plus the "Tail of the Dragon" with its 318 turns in 11 miles. 
