Treasurer's Message

I have served as Treasurer for the past two years. Previously, I was a board member for four years and very honored to serve....I became a member-at-large as soon as I joined the car club. I only knew a few people, but was welcomed by all and enjoyed attending the monthly meetings. Then my wife, Susan, got involved, and now we attend just about every club activity.

In our By-Laws, the Treasurer's duties are defined as: The Treasurer shall, subject to such conditions and restrictions as may be made by the officers, have custody of all monies, debts, and obligations belonging to the Club. All money of the Club shall be received and deposited into the Club account by the Treasurer. All debts of the Club shall be paid by the Treasurer. Any contracts, checking drafts, notes, or other orders for payment of money shall be co-signed in the name of the Club by the President and the Treasurer. The Treasurer shall be prepared to report on the financial status of the Club at every meeting. The Treasurer shall keep all club regalia and shall issue said regalia and new membership packets.

At our monthly meetings, I collect dues, sell 50/50 tickets, bring club regalia to sell and some for door prizes. If anyone has any bills that the club is responsible for, I will issue them a check for the amount. At out board meetings, once a month, I bring a financial statement for each person present. I also am responsible for all petty cash. Whenever we have a club event, the club raffles off a \$10.00 cash prize that I award. Sometimes we have BMCNO work gatherings or tech sessions, the club will usually buy food and drinks that I will write a check for. I write checks to Kinko's for printing and assembling the newsletter. Also, I purchase postage stamps for the mailings. This past year, there were mailings of t-shirts and some trophies also.

I also collect the club's mail at a Metairie post office box about twice a month. I then bring the mail to either board meetings or the monthly meetings. During the car show month, I pick up the mail more frequently to obtain the checks and registrations. I then make deposits in our bank account and balance the checking account monthly. The club has two checking accounts....one is a separate account just for the car show only. The car show month is very busy for me. Beside the mail pick-ups, I take care of any bills that we may need to pay for car show supplies, trophies, any services rendered, etc. On the day of the car show, I will collect receipts from any member and will pay accordingly.

The car club has been giving scholarships to Delgado Junior College for their automotive department. After the board of directors vote on the amount, I will write a check and then an officer will bring the check to Delgado.

I have enjoyed being a club member, board of director, and now Treasurer. I will be serving as Treasurer for one more year. I appreciate all the help, patience, and understanding I receive from all members.



Proposed Amendments to BMCNO By-laws by Ronnie Palmisano

I would like to propose the following amendments to the BMCNO by-laws

Section 7. "Dues are payable annually during the month that the member first joined." Change to "All annual memberships expire on June 30."

Section 13 Newsletter:

"A newsletter shall be published once a month and mailed before the regular monthly Club membership meeting." Remove "and mailed"

The amendment to Section 7 would make all dues due in June. This would simplify accounting for both the members and the board. The By-laws do not specify the amount of dues. This allows the board to pro-rate dues for 1st year members not joining in July.

The amendment to Section 13 would permit but not require an all-electronic newsletter.



Proposed Amendment to BMCNO By-Laws by Cathy Greensfelder

I would like to propose the following changes to the BMCNO by-laws in order to split the Newsletter Editor/Secretary office into two separate offices.

The Secretary would take the duties of maintaining the membership, recording minutes and handling proposed by-law changes and absentee ballots and would be subject to the same three year term limit as the rest of the board.

The Newsletter Editor would take the duty of publishing a newsletter and would be exempt from term limits.

The following changes are required as a group.

8b: **Current**: "The exception to the term limitation being that of the office of Editor/**Secretary**." **Change**: Remove "/Secretary"

8c: **Current**: "Number of Directors: The Board of Directors shall consist of **four** members, who shall also serve as the President, Vice-President, Newsletter Editor/Secretary, and Treasurer of the Club. "

Change: "Number of Directors: The Board of Directors shall consist of **five** members, who shall also serve as the President, Vice-President, Newsletter Editor, Secretary, and Treasurer of the Club."

9b:Current: "The exception to the term limitation being that of the Editor/Secretary." Change: Remove "/Secretary"

8d Current:

"Newsletter Editor/Secretary: The Newsletter Editor shall attend all meetings of the members and officers and keep records of all minutes and notes in a book kept for this purpose. The Newsletter Editor shall publish a club newsletter as set forth elsewhere in these by-laws. The editor shall keep an updated roll of all Club members."

Change::

"Secretary: The Secretary shall attend all meetings of the members and officers and keep records of all minutes and notes in a book kept for this purpose. The Secretary shall keep an updated roll of all Club members.

Newsletter Editor: The Newsletter Editor shall publish a club newsletter as set forth elsewhere in these by-laws. "

11: **Current**: "Any full, associate or student member in good standing, by written petition submitted to the **Newsletter Editor**/Secretary, may propose an amendment to the By-Laws. " **Change**: Remove "Newsletter Editor/"

12: Current: Absentee Voting:

Absentee ballots must be submitted to the **Newsletter Editor**/Secretary no later than 48 hours before any election or vote.

Change: Remove "Newsletter Editor/"

All other occurrences of the phrase "Newsletter Editor/Secretary" changed to "Newsletter Editor, Secretary". $\$
