#### April 24, 2007 General Meeting Minutes

Car Show: Allen Bradley gave the show financial report. There are still a few outstanding expenses but this is close to the final balance. This year the board made a conscious decision to spend some extra money and draw the show balance down. Also, we lost money on the banquet: we sold tickets at our cost and did not sell all the tickets. Reviewing the finances the board determined that we need \$5,000 in the bank to cover expenses for a typical show if we have to cancel or

#### Roger's Chocolate Chip Cookies

2 + ¼ Cups All Purpose Flour

2 Tsp. Cinnamon

1 Tsp. Salt

1 + ½ tbs. Baking Soda

1/4 C. Oatmeal ground fairly fine(I use a small food processor

½ lb. Butter (at room temp)

34 c. Granulated Sugar

3/4 c. Brown Sugar (firmly packed

2 eggs

2 tsp.. Vanilla

¼ tsp. Lemon Juice

3 c. Chocolate Chips

2 c. Chopped Walnuts (if desired)

Sift together the first 4 ingredients,


Mix in the ground oatmeal and set

aside.

Add the eggs one at a time stopping to scrape down the sides of the bowl. Add the Vanilla and Lemon Juice. Add the dry ingredients and mix. Mix in the Chocolate Chips and Nuts

Refrigerate at least overnight.



#### Baking

I generally scoop the cookies into a golf ball size and bake on parchment paper in a 350 Degree oven for about 12-13 Minutes. Time will vary depending on your oven , the size of the cookies and if you like them chewy or crispy.
