DORSET UPDATE

&

FRILOUX OIL CHANGE "THE REST OF THE STORY"

I was going to write a monthly newsletter article on the progress of my 1949 Austin of England Dorset. But, I thought that it would become boring after awhile as it has been in the works for years. The time has come for an update.

First some background information. The Dorset is a larger two door family sedan meant for export as apposed to the four door Devon home market model. These two models were a radical change for Austin. Many in England did not like the cars. The engine produced higher horse power (40) than previous models and this meant higher taxes.

Peter Brauen of BMC Restorations and I have worked together to bring the car to its present stage of restoration, which is drivable and awaiting exterior paint. It will be painted a pleasant shade of medium green. This has not been a normal restoration but more of a major upgrade. This is why it has taken so long to get the car to the stage that it is now. We have adapted & modified everything!



The engine has been replaced with a MGB 1800 unit. The brakes have been upgrade with Austin Healey and MGB parts. It has Austin Healey front discs and MGB rear drums, a dual circuit master cylinder with a vacuum booster, more modern tires on Triumph rims, hydraulically operated clutch, and modern turning signals while retaining the old trafficator signals (semaphores).

The whole car has been treated in this fashion while maintaining an original look inside and out. It not a "hot rod", but it is much more modern in function.

At the recent club oil change event, Wally Friloux discovered that no one could remove the transmission filler plug on his beloved red TR6. It was stuck tight and very difficult to get a wrench on! Everyone wisely decided to stop trying to do so before the plug was completely rounded.

Wally asked me if I would give the job a go at my garage. I agreed to take on. I spent some time thinking of just how I get the job done.

To my delight, Wally had purchased a bolt extractor kit from Sears. I felt that with this small tool the filler plug could be removed without having to remove the car's transmission cover as there is limited space between the plug and the transmission cover.

Using a 1/4" ratchet, socket, & a large screwdriver the job was accomplished. There was just enough room for the assembly to fit in place. The large screwdriver was used as a leverage bar between the transmission housing and the ratchet head to load the extraction tool against the filler plug. It turned out to be a piece of cake.


Having the proper tool for the job is always a pleasure. P.S. After all this it turns out that the transmission did not need any oil!
