#### THOSE BRITISH WIRING CONNECTORS by Jim Jones

The typical way to tie together two or more wires in a British car's electrical system is through the use of rubber sleeved metal connectors. They are not without their problems. The metal connectors do not hold up well over time. They spilt and can leave a poor mechanical and electrical connection. This problem has been solved. New connectors are made with the metal part twice as thick as the old parts and the rubber sleeves are made out of a superior vinyl material.

Short of replacing the wiring harness in your British car with a new one, changing out the sleeved connectors with new ones is the next best thing you can do for your car's electrical system, and it is inexpensive.

In order to not damage wires when removing the old connectors, do the following. If the bullet at the end of a wire does not pull out easily from the connector, cut the connector's rubber sleeve using a razor knife and remove it. Now you can use of a small screwdriver to pry open the metal connector and safely remove the bullet.

Do not use sandpaper to clean the bullets. This will remove the protective coating on the bullet and cause it to corrode more quickly. If need be, simply wash the bullets off with a liquid solvent.

When installing the bullets into the new connector, the bullets should snap into place. If they do not, they are not properly seated. A special tool is available but a small screwdriver can be utilized to push the bullet in all the way. Be careful not to damage the insulation on the wire as you do so.

The safest way to install new connectors is as follows. Push the metal connector out of its rubber sleeve. Slide the rubber sleeve over the wire or wires to be inserted into one end of the metal connector. Place all the bullets into the metal connector. If they do not seat easily, carefully use a pair of pliers to leverage them into position. Now slide the rubber sleeve into place. The bullets will be seated properly into the new connector and without damage. It takes a little more time to accomplish this but it is well worth it.

A dielectric grease is available at your local auto parts store and I strongly recommend using it when reassembling the connectors. This substance is used on all newer cars to prevent moisture from entering an electrical connector or plug. Follow the direction on the package.

#### **NUTS** by Rick Huber

We've heard stories of people getting stranded with a flat tire that the tire shop put on too tight and couldn't be removed. Here's one about what happens when the lug nuts are too loose.

I towed "Della", our Chelsea Grey 66 MGB, to Peter Brauen's place in Kiln, MS on July 5. I hurriedly picked up the U-Haul tow dolly about 4:30 on the 4th, loaded Della, and left for a party, thinking I was ready to set out the next morning.

I stopped after 30 miles to check the straps on the tow dolly, and everything looked fine. I got up to about 10 mph while pulling back onto the interstate, when I glanced in the side mirror and to my utter horror and amazement, I saw a wheel rolling across the interstate behind Della. I pulled back over and got out to find that the left rear wheel had come off and rolled into the median.

I thought about what must have happened - I had been rolling Della around my garage for years, taken the wheels on and off a couple of times, and figuring that I would be rebuilding brakes before rolling it very far, I never did tighten the lug nuts more than finger tight. Of course on the left side the direction of rotation loosens the lug nuts, and somewhere along the interstate they had all fallen off. Thank the Lord for centrifugal force and the gyroscopic effect of rotating objects, or I really would have had a mess had the wheel come off at 60 mph.

I thought for a minute about what to do with no tools and no jack to get under Della. I thought about AAA, thought about calling Mary Lynne to bring me my floor jack and tools, but then I decided to look and see what Volvo offered for jack and lug nut tools. Wouldn't you know it, I adapted the jack to get Della's left rear wheel off the ground and one of the two lug nut wrenches fit the rostyle nuts. I borrowed 2 lug nuts from each of the two front wheels (on the tow dolly) and I was back on the road in about 10 minutes.

My shame for not tightening the lug nuts was replaced with pride in my ingenuity in extricating myself from the mess I had gotten into. In the end, it is a relatively painless example of the trouble with too loose lug nuts.

It could have been much worse. Just imagine what those other drivers must have thought with those lug nuts falling off and bouncing down the highway!!!
