Lunch was at Duffy's Diner (50's theme, burgers & milkshakes and they serve kiddie meals in boxes shaped like 50's era cars). After lunch, the Bradley's & Greensfelder's toured the Rip Van Winkle Gardens and House. Dave & Menda Hayden laid out a nice 2 hour cruise around the area for later in the afternoon. They found every twisty little road they could. Nine British cars participated, including a couple of Lafayette area enthusiasts that are not (yet!) members of BMCNO. 

It was gratifying to see how the 17th Annual New Orleans British Car Day paralleled the resurgence of the city after Hurricane Katrina. This year, more than 100 classic British vehicles were on hand, with even more car owners and enthusiasts sharing their passion for all things British.

Entrants drove from as far away as Michigan and Illinois to attend this year's March 24 event at the Delgado Community College. They were greeted by the beautiful Louisiana springtime weather, a particularly nice change for those who braved the wintery northern highways to reach New Orleans.

Chosen from a field of 28 classes of British cars, the Best of Show trophy was awarded to Bill Silhan's 1951 Daimler Empress. Other winners included Pat Cashman's 1950 Armstrong Siddeley Station Coupe, Mike Lewis's 1950 MG Y-series and Brent Bordelon's lovely white 1937 SS Jaguar 1.5-liter saloon. The Tourist Trophy Garage award for the most unmolested vehicle was awarded to a 1967 Jaguar 240 Saloon.

Following the judging, class trophies were given out at an official Awards Banquet. Attendees filled up on a fantastic New Orleans meal, which included typical Louisiana fare such as andouille gumbo, stuffed chicken with shrimp dressing and New Orleans style bread pudding. MG 2007 by Bill Harris

MG 2007 is now history. The show was held at the Doubletree hotel on the edge of Napa valley, about an hour's drive north of San Francisco. The show this year was to be on the second day after the start of the convention so that the participants did not to have to worry about the condition of their cars for two days. Those two days were filled with driving tours, some guided by the locals and others designed by the locals with maps and detailed instructions given.

Monday, the first day was arrival for most people attending the show. Nothing was scheduled except hospitality, and there was plenty of that. It was great seeing and socializing with friends that we have met at the other NAMGBR conventions.

Tuesday was the day of the car show followed by a driving tour that afternoon through vineyards and redwood forests to an artist community at Occidental, California to eat at the Union Hotel. This trip was made by over 150 attendees. It was amazing to see that many MGs on the road at one time and how they overwhelmed the town of Occidental.

Wednesday was a day of several guided tours, one through the wine country and another was the Mille de Mendocino which was the cornerstone of activity. The Mille was designed to resemble some of the long distance vintage tours that are held in Europe each year. Special license plates were given to the participants. The tour took approximately 8 to 9 hours with numerous stops to sight see and shop. It started by heading out to the coast and to the town of Bodega (remember Hitchcock's "The Birds"), up the Pacific Coast Highway, through Gualala (a great whale and seal watching stop) and then to Mendocino with a two hour stop for shopping. The town of Mendocino was originally an instrumental source of wood products for San Francisco and now serves as a major tourist stop with bed and breakfasts, marine and agricultural economy, and surrounding vineyards. From Mendocino, the tour went through the redwood forests on its way back to the hotel.

We elected to pass on this tour after the long drive that we already undertook and instead decided to spend the day in San Francisco. We saw most of the main tourist places; Fisherman's Wharf, Pier 39, Chinatown. (We had a great lunch and shopped there.) Lombard Street (the crookest street in the world and actually had to try it twice) Haight-Ashbury (visited several shops and toured the neighborhood on it's 40th Anniversary of the "Summer of Love), and the Golden Gate Bridge and Park.

Thursday was filled with more local tours in which we participated in a great tour of the Napa valley wine country which included a stop for lunch and a tour of a local winery with tastings.

The Awards Banquet was held later in the evening right after a silent auction of which I watched like a hawk for an item that I just had to have. I got it!

Friday was the day of goodbyes for us but several stayed over the extra day to make the guided tour to San Francisco.

Each day the hospitality suite was open with refreshments, in the morning with juices, coffee and sweet rolls, and at night with snacks, soft drinks, British beer and of course, Napa wine.

John Twist of University Motors, and who is NAMGBR's technical advisor, gave tech sessions every day. Many cars formed in long lines to have their problems diagnosed, with some being repaired. Some were referred to local shops here where serious things could be repaired before their return trip home. There were bad water pumps, universal joints, burnt valves, clutches going bad, failed shocks, carburetors too rich, et. Al.

This year we decided not to bring either of our MGs and I ended up being one of six judges of the Concours. I think that I had the hardest job, at least it took the longest (over two hours), by having to judge the cars on originality. The hardest part was judging all entrants equally, so I decided not to add up my points on the scoring sheets as the cars were judged. This must have worked for me because after it was all over I couldn't tell who had won the Concours; I had to wait until the Awards Banquet like everyone else.

As planned, the return trip was extremely busy . We made stops at 7 National Parks on the way home. We toured Yosemite, Sequoia, Kings Canyon, Death Valley (temperature of 115 degrees with no other cars visible for 7 miles in either direction), Grand Canyon, Petrified Forest and the Painted Desert. We also included a stop in Las Vegas to experience the country's best gaming and tourist spots (daytime temperature 102 degrees) and finally in Roswell, NM to the Alien museum on it's 50th anniversary. On the way, we traveled old Route 66 to see the sights of a bygone era. We arrived back home after being gone for two weeks and traveling over 5600 miles.

We are already making plans to attend MG 2008 in Valley Forge, PA on June 26-29, 2008, and MG 2009 in Breckenridge, CO on June 23-27, 2009. Both shows have websites (MG2008.com, and MG2009.com) and promise to be great shows with plenty of activities and MGs.
