Delgado Tech Session by Susan Bradley

On Saturday, Nov. 8, Delgado's Automotive Department offered a seminar and use of their equipment for front-end Joe Cruthirds and alignments. Eric Babcock were Instructor there for our British car club members. Allen Bradley brought his 1970 MGB and 1971 TR6, with Pete Weber driving the TR6. Keith Vezina brought

his 1976 MGB.

Instructor Eric Babcock gave us a one hour lecture followed by a video. This was required before we could use the Hunter frontend alignment machine. This equipment cost \$30,000.00. We all were so interested and amazed that we would be using this computerized machine.

The alignment heads had to be installed on all four wheels. The last car was Allen's TR6. We aligned the front-end and the rear. We were able to do the rear because the TR6 has independent rear suspension. In order to do the rear end adjustment for correct alignment, Keith, Pete and Allen had to remove shims from the trailing arms of the suspension.

We found that all 3 cars were in need of some adjustments. We also noticed a big difference; the car does not pull and drives much straighter.

This was really fun and interesting to do on our cars. All of us really enjoyed learning how to do the alignment. We appreciate Delgado's efforts, especially giving up their Saturday to open for our club.

Of course, we ended the tech seminar at Parkway Bakery with a roast beef po-boy.



Meeting Guest Speaker Joe Cruthirds by Cathy Greensfelder



Joe Cruthirds, chairman of the Delgado Automotive Department, spoke at the October 28th meeting. He expressed his regret over the last month's cancelled tech session. The alignment machine has been fixed and the session rescheduled. He requested that any cars brought for an align-

ment have good tires and good parts – sound ball joints, tie rods, etc. If the front end isn't sound, they can't do an alignment. Also, if you've got a manual, bring it. And be forewarned that some of our cars may be too small to fit on the rails of the machine.

Joe wanted to express his heartfelt thanks to BMCNO. Our car show has been great for the Automotive Department in many ways but especially for the scholarships. His department has struggled for years to get scholarships. Joe is so happy it has finally happened.

Joe invited all of us to come by and visit the department. The new paint booth is almost ready and Joe's very excited about it. For years, they ran the collision department out of a "closet". The new 6,500 square foot space is great! They were blown away by the participation in the shop tours at our last show. They plan to give tours again and hopefully the new paint booth will be

ready.

Joe was pleased that enrollment is up but last year they had problems placing graduates with manufacturers. Delgado has two manufacturers' programs, the Ford ASSET program and the General Motors ASEP program. However, the fuel crises of the past summer had local dealers worried about layoffs so they weren't hiring. Hopefully that will not be the case by next May.

One of our members asked if Delgado needed a car for a project for the students. Joe replied, no. The industry has been changing very rapidly and the students need to work on new vehicles, not old ones. The technology is totally different between a modern car and one of our 30 year-old classics.

The collision program has classes meeting four nights a week and two BMCNO members are in the program this semester. The collision program is primarily taught by George Torlage and Dave Manno. George, as we know, is the paint guy. Dave is primarily a metal guy – his teaching area is body and fender. Currently, Delgado is offering two sessions on MIG welding, one daytime and one evening. George teaches the paint and body class. He wants to split the course into two separate courses. The fall semester would be body work, with just enough paint technique to do the priming. Then George wants to do the serious painting in the spring semester. That would require two semesters for our members whose cars need body work. But tuition is only \$350 per course, \$60 for students over 60 years of age!
