General Meeting Minutes

Guests and new members included returning members Ron and Sandy Williams. Sandy bought Gene Graham's TR7 about four or five years ago. The meeting was the TR7's first drive in "forever"! This was Jim Clark's first meeting. Jim bought a TR6 a year ago in Gulfport and has an MGA in pieces. John Lechart was present with his son John Jr. John has a recently purchased 77 MGB.

Past events: The Northshore gathering on Thursday Oct 30 had around a dozen members. Wally Friloux reported that there was lots of conversation and socializing. One of the main topics was that most of members present were not willing to drive to the Southshore for the regular meeting.

There are approximately 15 BMCNO members in the Baton Rouge area. Rick Huber is planning a Baton Rouge gathering on the 2nd Tuesday of each month. The first gathering will be December 9th.

Robert Rougelot won the E. E. Reynolds Ralley, despite stopping for thirty minutes in a bar. Unfortunately, there was a bridge on the route that was CLOSED FOR THE DAY!! Joy!

Three members brought their cars to the Delgado front end alignment seminar on Saturday November 8th.

Future Events: Plans for the Christmas party were discussed. Plans for a Middendorf's run on January 25th were discussed. (See calendar).

Dave Hayden had been talking about rescheduling the Funkana sometime in February, but it will have to take place later in the year. (It was cancelled because of Hurricanes Gustav.)

Car Show: The board has been seriously considering not selling T-shirts this year. T-shirts are a major up-front expense and we have lost money on them before and frequently just break even. Also shirts are a "pain in the neck" to handle. SABCC didn't have shirts for their last show.

Club Business: Allen Bradley made a treasurer's report. Copies are available by request.

There was a lot of discussion about the proposed bylaws change to reduce a quorum from the current 20% to 10% of the membership. A group of members were concerned that 10% of 113 members is only 11 people. That's the 9 board members plus two. They wondered why the change was needed. Greensfelder pointed out that the distribution of the membership has changed. Attendance is down on the general membership meeting because less than 50% of current members live in the Southshore Greater New Orleans (GNO) area. Cathy mentioned the possibility of making members outside the GNO area non-voting members or at least making nonvoting status available as an option. There was opposition to that idea from members on both sides of the amendment argument. People were generally against disenfranchising members based on geography. The problem is that it is becoming more and more difficult for the club to transact business under the current bylaws. We had only one member above a quorum for our last election. Technically, we don't even have a "meeting" unless we have 21 members.


