

12th Annual Richard Wolf UnCar Show by Cathy Greensfelder

After a morning of rain, we ended up with pretty decent weather for the 12th Annual Richard Wolf Un-Car Show on August 16th, 2009. Thirty BMCNO members met at the Columbia Street Tap Room and Grill in Covington to "honor" nine of the "not ready for prime time" cars in the club.

There were some difficult decisions to be made because all in all, the cars present (with one notable exception) were in very good shape. Allen Bradley's MGB took the "Body Shop Award" for biggest dent. When his name was called, his wife stood up and exclaimed "What dent?!" It's a small dent near the door hinge, but it was the best one there. Ronnie Palimsano's TR6, a former Goodwill winner, has slowly but steadily improved over the years as Ronnie finds time to work on it. This year all it qualified for was the Interior Award. Baton Rouge Gathering By Rick Huber

There were 20 of us at our BR gathering this month. Thanks to Bill Avery shaking the trees to have a few of his friends from some other car clubs drop in to spend the evening with us.

Enthusiasm for cars and driving is shared across many marques and models, and we had a good time tonight.

Paul Hornsby talked about his trip to the NAMGAR meet in Arkansas where he went with his MGA. Tom Miller said the Syngenta show on Aug 1 brought out 103 cars, but Wayne Pangburn and his TR4 was the only British car there. The charity event raised \$11,500 to fight cancer. Tom also visited the Rural Life Museum, the Bluebonnet Swamp, and Magnolia Mound and talked about his impressions for a potential BR group event early next year.

Milton Franklin and Danny Varnado talked about the things to see and do around Jackson, LA, which would also make a good event. Finally, Rick Huber talked about a driving outing from Sorrento over to Springfield and then back to Port Vincent for a meal at Berthelot's. Another idea was hatched to combine a drive from Sorrento through some back roads and into Baton Rouge for the Rural Life museum, and then of course somewhere to eat. Still some decisions to be made.

Our guest speaker was Louis Altazan, owner of AGCO Automotive in Baton Rouge, and he talked to us about getting the best value for our transportation dollars with our daily drivers. He repeated some of the typical things like buying mid-priced cars about 3 years old to avoid the roughly 60 % depreciation, then driving the car for 10 years, but also shared his wisdom about service - changing timing belts, coolant, brake fluid, cabin filters, and using the right kind of parts to keep that car on the road for the 10 years you want to drive it. He recommends OEM parts to avoid problems and having a shop you trust take a look at your car every 12 15,000 miles. The key tip for the evening is how to decide when to change your coolant - when the pH gets to 7 from it's original 8 - 8.5. Never would have thought of that.

Healey project By Rick Huber

The two words to describe this part of the Healey project are sanding and painting, as in me sanding and Peter painting. We've sanded and primed the inside and ouside of all the steel body panels except the boot lid. There is still some work to do on the two shrouds by an aluminum welder Peter is trying to schedule. Now that I'm retired, there will be more than 2 restoration days per month, so the project should pick up speed.





Karen's Triumph TR6 Restoration Part One by Ronnie Palmisano

In January 2006 I received a call from Allen Bradley. Allen said that he located a *great looking* 1975 TR6 and the owner was willing to give away for free. The only stipulation was that it had to be removed that same day.

I immediately drove over to meet Allen and the owner while thinking about restoring the car and giving it to my wife.

When I arrived there was a yard full of cars. They were buried under the tree debris from the recent hurricanes. It wasn't a pretty sight, but I have seen worse.



There was a complete white TR6 (no floors and sad interior) and a partial red TR6. I knew if I brought both of these home that I would be in trouble. I only brought the white one home and I still ended up in trouble. I explained to my wife Karen that this would someday be her new shiny red sports car. She asked if is was on drugs because only a miracle could make this car look good and function as a car. She did consider using it as a planter for her flowers.

I then completely disassembled this little gem. I removed all mechanical items, took off all body panels and then separated the body from the frame.

It then sat for some time. The longer it stayed in it's current condition the more trouble I was in.

I attempted to sandblast the frame here at home, but my compressor didn't have the capacity to do the job. Someone suggested that I take it to Stuart McKendrick's garage on Oak Street. Stuart had a large shop compressor for use with the sandblaster.

I managed to get the frame and body tub to the Oak Street garage with help from Keith Vezina . Unfortunately I didn't have time to work on it there. It sat there for a long time. During this time rust managed to do damage to the frame and body tub.

It's now August 2009 and I must get this car restored.

I contacted Peter Brauen at BMC Restorations. I mentioned to Peter that:

- The body tub needed both floors replaced.
- The metal below the battery was missing.
- It needed a new boot (trunk) floor.
- There was a section rusted through on the chassis.
- It has rust holes on both outer sills.

Peter said "No Problem. Bring it over "

With the help of Keith Vevina, Cliff Hughes and Stuart McKendrick we picked up the chassis and body tub and placed it on Cliff's trailer. I then drove it to Peter for him to get started on the repairs. Peter will repair the chassis and body tub.
