TR6 Brake Servo by Ronnie Palmisano



I was driving my 1976 TR6 approaching an intersection on Veterans Blvd. in Metairie. You know, the intersection with the traffic cameras.

The light turned amber as I approached and I pressed

down on the brake pedal. Nothing happened. I pressed harder and pulled up on the parking brake lever and the car came to a stop. It took lots of leg effort to make the car stop.

After getting my crippled car home I discovered that the vacuum servo (brake booster) diaphragm had failed. I already knew that the rebuilding kits that were available didn't have the necessary diaphragm, so rebuilding was not an option.

The Buckeye Triumphs Technical website (buckeyetriumphs.org/technical/technical.htm) has an excellent article on Overhauling the Brake Servo, however without a replacement diaphragm this didn't help.

The article did mention the name of a company that rebuilds brake servos. I contacted them and then no longer rebuilt brake servos.

After searching the web for someone that does this rebuild I found another company.

While in the process of locating another company, Pete Weber, another club member, mentioned that he had his brake servo rebuilt by the same company that I located. Pete said that they did an excellent job.

They are Brake Materials and Parts, 800 Sherman Blvd, Fort Wayne, Indiana 46808 260-426-3331

I talked to Scott and he said that he cleans, blasts and paints the units and replaces all soft parts including the seals, valves and diaphragm. The rebuild cost me \$95 plus \$10.00 shipping.

Scott can arrange to have the shells powder coated at an additional cost.

I sent mine off to Scott and in ten days I had it back. The outer shell looks really great considering the amount of rust that was on it.

Until recently new units were no longer available. British parts Northwest now has a reproduction servo available for only \$211.00. Other suppliers may also have them.

So the choice is yours, Rebuild for \$110.00 or purchase a new one for \$210.00 plus about \$14.19 shipping. Sometimes these cannot be rebuilt due to rust.

No I didn't receive a ticket in the mail.

From here, we will travel on country roads through the village of Port Vincent and then on to the Rural life Museum on Essen Lane in Baton Rouge.


We should arrive at the Rural Life Museum a little before **11:00**. \$7.00 Entry Fee.

Lucas Replacement Smoke Kit As seen on ebay... Thanks Court Musgrave

NOS Lucas Replacement Wiring Harness Smoke Kit

As seen on Ebay...

Have you inadvertently let the smoke out of the wires on your classic British car? This, then, is the solution to your problem!

Here is presented for your perusal one Lucas Replacement Wiring Harness Smoke kit, P/N 530433, along with the very rare Churchill Tool 18G548BS adapter tube meterina and valve. These kits were supplied surreptitiously to Lucas factory technicians as a trouble-shooting and repair aid for the rectification of chronic electrical problems on a plethora British cars.





smoke is metered, through the fuse box, into the circuit which has released it's original smoke until the leak is located and repaired. The affected circuit is then rectified and the replacement smoke reintroduced. An advantage over the cheap repro smoke kits currently available is the exceptionally rare Churchill metering valve and fuse box adapter. It enables the intrepid and highly skilled British Car Technician to meter the precise amount of genuine Lucas smoke required by the circuit.

Unlike the cheap, far-eastern replacement DIYsmoke offered by the "usual suppliers", this kit includes a filter to ensure that all the smoke is of consistent size, It has been our experience in our shop that the reproduction Taiwanese smoke is often "lumpy", which will cause excessive resistance in our finely-engineered British harnesses and components. This is often the cause of failure in the repro electrical parts currently available, causing much consternation and misplaced cursing of the big three suppliers.

These kits have long been the secret weapon of the "Ultimate Authorities" in the trade, and this may be the last one available. Be forewarned, though, that it is not applicable to any British vehicle built after the discontinuing of bullet connectors, so you Range Rover types are still on your own...

This Genuine Factory Authorized kit contains enough smoke to recharge the entire window circuit on a 420 Jaguar, and my dear friend and advisor George Wolf of British Auto Specialty assures me that he can replace ALL the smoke in a W&F Barrett All-Weather Invalid Car(147 CC) with enough left over to test a whole box of Wind-Tone horns for escaped smoke. How much more of an endorsement do you need?

More, you say? Well, I once let the smoke out of the overdrive wiring on my friend Roger Hankey's TR3B, and was able to drive over 200 miles home from The Roadster Factory Summer Party by carefully introducing smoke into the failed circuit WITHOUT even properly repairing the leak. Another friend, Richard Stephenson, was able to repair the cooling fan circuit of his Series 1 E-type by merely replacing a fuse and injecting a small quantity of smoke back into the wires. So there!

So, if you're troubled by lost smoke, bid early and bid often! Thanks for looking!


