Minutes - May 25, 2010

Roger Nagy reported that bearings are "protected" parts. If you order anything from Great Britain containing bearings, you should expect the shipment to be delayed in customs. Customs wanted Roger to break out the price of the bearings in an assembly he purchased. You should bring the old bearing with you – they usually can identify them and find replacements. Printed Newsletter Analysis

If you are reading this article, you are seeing the results of the analysis that the Board of Directors has been doing on the monthly newsletters. The result of the analysis is that the newsletter will no longer be mailed out in hard copy form. The hard copy mailing of the newsletter was costing almost as much as the member dues, but more importantly, it was limiting the amount of information that could be sent to the members in the newsletter. The hard copy of the newsletter could only be done in black and white, so any pictures of club activities or other information would not be the best quality. The mailing requirements limited the size of the newsletter to 12 pages which on occasion prevented showing all the information that the editor thought was of value to the club.

Some facts about the newsletter. Of the 124 members in 2009 – 2010, only 39 had requested the hard copy of the newsletter be sent to them. Although the 2010- 2011 membership forms are not all in, it appears there will be even less people requesting the mailed newsletter this year. In 2009, the total cost of the printing and postage was \$1.92 for each newsletter sent out and that did not include the time spent by the editor doing

the printing, folding, stamping, and mailing. And by not sending the hard copies of the newsletter out, there are two trees in the forest that will be able to enjoy the sunshine for the next five years.

This newsletter is the first of the all electronic version of the monthly BMCNO Newsletter. It is available on the web page and when the 2010 - 2011 membership forms are all submitted, it will be emailed to the members personal email address. Although this version is not much different than the past newsletter, the editor, with the help of others have big plans for including more information that the club membership will find useful and entertaining.

One other benefit of discontinuing the mailing of the newsletter is that if frees up some money for the club to do other things that can benefit the members. The first of these items is the setting up of the British Motoring Club Resource Library. This library will contain information specific to British Car ownership. Three videos have already been purchased (for the cost of less than one month's mailing cost) that will be previewed at club meetings and will then be available to the members to check out. The details of the Resource Library are still being worked out so keep reading future newsletters to find out more.

Wow! It's impossible to get members to send articles. This month we have two great articles on the same event. Thanks Danny and Rick!

Wow, what a turnout! We had 18 people at the Baton Rouge chapter gathering on Tuesday June 22 including two new members of the club attending their first meeting. After enjoying dinner and talking about little British car stuff, Rick went through a brief agenda. We welcomed first time attendees Dana Varnado, Danny's wife, Gale Linster, a BR businessman with a 2001 Jaguar XK8 referred to us by Reg Dunbar, and Jim Bowers, an LSU law professor and the proud owner of a 1951 MG TD that he just drove home from St. Louis, referred to us by Jeff Cobb.

Danny Varnado then talked about the Baton Rouge cruise for those of us who hadn't participated. It was a great event, with 11 little British cars touring around the winding two-lane roads in the Maurepas swamp, and something we're planning to do more of in the Baton Rouge area, perhaps on a quarterly schedule. Rick went over upcoming events – the Columbia St. Block Party, the Lafayette cruise, and the membership meeting in the next week, and then the Delgado Tech Session and the Uncar show in the next couple of months. Tom Miller mentioned the Syngenta show in July, and he'll send us information about it soon.

Then Rick introduced Chris Medine, owner-operator of Medine Collison Center in Baton Rouge, who talked to us about getting body work done after a fender bender. Chris focused on the rights we have as customers of insurance companies to make sure we get OEM parts and correct work done on our cars. He suggested that we not allow our insurance company to "push" us into going to one of their Direct Repair Program shops

since those shops have been contracted by the insurance company, and in many cases take shortcuts and use after-market parts that are not in the best interest of the vehicle owner. He also mentioned a list of what he considers preferred insurance companies that he believes do things right by the owner and the repair facility. Those are State Farm, Allstate, Safeco, Farm Bureau, and USAA. Thanks to Chris, those of us in attendance now know quite a bit more about the process of getting our vehicles repaired should that happen to us.

Project Update – 1964 Austin Healey 3000

Rick Huber trailered his Austin Healey back to Peter's shop at the end of May after having the exterior painted by Stephen Klein of Klein's Automotive in Kenner. Stephen owned the disassembled car since 1993, and stored it in pieces, first in his shop first in Baton Rouge where Rick first saw it, and then later in Kenner. Club member Maury Drummond bought it from him in 2005, who then sold it to Peter Brauen in 2006, who then sold it to Rick in 2007 without ever moving it out of Stephen's shop. So after Peter and Rick moved it to Peter's shop in 2008 and spent 20 months (2 or 3 days per month) doing frame, chassis, and body work, it was fitting that the Austin Healey made its way back to Stephen's shop for final prep and painting. Now that the car is finished in a beautiful, two-tone, Ivory White over Healey Blue, Rick is eager to put it back together and get it on the road. He and Peter are reassembling the Healey in Peter's shop, and if all goes well, Rick hopes to be driving it by the end of the year.

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
