January 25, 2011 Meeting Minutes

The Members meeting was held on January 25th 2011 at 7:00 p.m. at the Italian Pie on Jefferson Highway. Twenty members were in attendance with 29 people at the meeting. The meeting was called to order at 7:02 p.m. by President Karen Murray. New Member O.J. Williams introduced his wife Dolly and discussed his recent purchase of a 1974 Purple/Maroon TR6, currently not running. Karen also introduced an observer from Seattle named David with a 1968 car. The Car Show Brochure was handed out to all in attendance.

Karen discussed the Christmas Party, where 125 pounds of food was collected to benefit the Second Harvester's Food Bank. 20 Raffle prizes were presented at that event to those that brought food donations. Allen Bradley discussed the Delgado electrical class, with 17 members attending. He was impressed with the presentation and with the hands on activities following. After the formal class, Randy had discussions with each person to help with specific car problems. These tech sessions are offered as appreciation for the scholarships presented to Delgado students. It was also mentioned that Louisiana Technical College on Airline is now part of the Delgado system. Rick Huber discussed the restoration class, also at Delgado. There are 10 BMCNO members in a class of 17 students.

Cliff Hughes reported on the North Shore meeting with 10 members in attendance. Progress is being made on Sponsorships and Giveaways for the Annual Car Show. Cliff also re-iterated that there are many significant auto dealer owners, both new and used represented in the club. When looking for a car, we should look them up.

Rick Huber reported on the Baton Rouge meeting with 13 members and 20 attendees. A national list of Gas Stations still selling gas without Ethanol was discussed. Rick also presented his Car Value presentation, resulting in a three way tie with 16 points.

With the club showing a profit, we have the ability to acquire new material, all based on member recommendations, so if there is something you would like to see or would think someone else might like to see, please bring it to his attention.

Bob also discussed the Houmas House Plantation Tour. He is currently working on arrangements to visit the "Cars of Yesteryear" sometime in July. This news was very well received by the attendees.

Vice President Rick Huber discussed the following: Feliciana cruise, Middendorf's Restaurant, Car show still needs volunteers, and the Crawfish Boil on May 15th at Tickfaw State Park.

Keith Vezina discussed a request by the Krewe of Bird, an all woman marching club, for convertibles to use in a short parade. Keith, Allen, Ronnie, and Jack volunteered for the event. It will be held on Friday, February 18th at 7:00 p.m.
