
There will be something for everyone. You will enjoy car judging, great food, conversation and especially the A/C in the restaurant.

Back in 1998 we were all talking about what could we do in the summer. It's hot. It's muggy. No one wants to be outside or detail their car but we wanted to do something. So someone, I think it was Cliff Hughes, had this thought: what if we have a


sort of anti-show for all the WORST cars in the club? Don't wash and wax, have it in a restaurant, inside in the A/C. Park the cars outside and just talk about them!! So we decided to do it, hoping no one would get offended having their car named "worst" in something.

Richard Wolf had been a member since 1996 and wanted to get more involved. He volunteered to put on the event. He found the restaurant, arranged for them to open just for us, arranged for a prix fixe menu, got the street blocked off, bought ribbons.

Bill Breithoff found the "Goodwill Trophy". We tell everyone it's named after the store where we got it but really, Bill dug it out of the back of a closet and artistically broke it!! Bill at-tached a piece of duct tape to the back and inscribed the winner in black permanent marker. The trophy was

awarded to the car most in need of total restoration, with the understanding that the loving cup would be returned the following year to be passed on to the next winner.

Then we hoped folks would come and enter their cars and not get mad if they got an award. And they did! In fact, people competed for the "awards". During the first couple Un-Car Shows, Roy Richardson taped a yard stick to the side of his TR8 so the judges could see how long the dent was. Charlie Ake hauled his car in on a trailer, no engine, no interior, no top... Dave Hayden wanted to participate but just couldn't face driving in from Abbeville (three and a half hours) in August without A/C. So he drove his red Miata. And brought a life-size, cardboard yellow TR6 facade that he put on the side of the Miata. The cut-out car had real TR6 hub caps and side mirror. (We gave him a certificate for "most in need of being real"!! Peter Braun started out from Bay St Louis in his British car, but it broke down just a few miles out. He had it towed home and came in his Japanese car. We wrote modified a Participation Award certificate to be a Non-Participation Award for him. When New Orleans was evacuated for Hurricane Katrina, Ronnie Palmisano made sure he took the Goodwill trophy with him so it wouldn't be lost in the storm!!



Richard Wolf, instrumental in creating this event, passed away in April of 2000. In memory of his passing, the UnCar Show was renamed the Richard Wolf Annual UnCar Show, continuing the tradition of honoring those members that have gone before that were instrumental in making the club what it is today.

Gunk Award—For dirtiest engine.

Interior Award— For worst interior

Primer Award—For worst paint

Grand Canyon Award—For the biggest dash board split



So How Do Operating Costs For a Modern British Car Compare To Other Non British Cars? By Don Marpe



You may remember my previous article on the operating costs of my 1997 Jaguar XK8. I had the Jag for over ten years and drove it over 150,000 miles and kept good track of the costs to maintain and operate it. For this article, I

am just going to look at the maintenance costs. Depreciation and insurance tend to be biased toward higher priced cars and make it hard to do a true comparison.



For the Jag, the total cost for maintenance and gas over the 10 years I owned the car was \$39,359. \$15,173 of that was for gas. The total cost per mile was \$0.23. That breaks down to \$0.09 for gas, \$0.02 for scheduled maintenance, and \$0.10 for broke / fix maintenance. With some miscellaneous items the cost per mile less gas was \$0.13.



For my first non British car, I chose my wife's Chrysler 300M. She had that car for 10 years also but only put on 80,000 miles. I did not track the

costs for gas on her car, but the total maintenance costs were \$7,513 or \$0.09 per mile. Since I was able to do the normal maintenance work myself, I could say that the costs should be \$0.02 higher to be comparable with the Jag costs. That makes me feel a little better.

My next non British car makes me feel a lot better about the Jag, but not so good about that car. My other car is a Porsche Boxster that I have had for six years and put 75,000 miles on. Since I cannot even see the engine on this car, there is no way I can do much of the maintenance. The scheduled maintenance cost was \$5,637 which is a little over \$0.08 per mile. The broke / fix maintenance costs totaled \$10,216 or \$0.14 per mile. That number is a little biased by the cost for tires. Tires alone were \$1,982 of that cost. I drove the car right after Katrina when you did not measure tire life by the amount of tread left. You measured the life by how many roofing nails had been removed and



when you finally got one in the side wall that could not be patched. The total maintenance cost of \$0.22 per mile surprised me when I figured all of this up. Maybe it is time to look at another little British car to get my convertible fix. I wonder what the operating costs are for one of those.









E.E. Reynolds Memorial Rallye Remembered by Chad C. Wicker

The Early Years — Part 1 of 3



Our club was founded in early 1977 by a MG enthusiast, Eldridge E. Reynolds and his wife Diana. They moved to North Louisiana in the fall of the same year, though the club continued.

In November of 1978 driving his Chevelle in North Louisiana, Eldridge was killed in an accident. That same year, the club decided to hold an annual Rallye to honor him.

Little information is available about the rallye's early years from information in available records. The 1st rallye was held in January 1979 by Jon and Toni (Creel), in and around Metairie. The 2nd rallye was held the same year in November, marking the beginning of the traditional month of the observance. This was the first rallye where the loving cup was passed to the winners, with the winners hosting, and designing the next year's rallye.

I have little information on the 3rd annual rallye, but it had to have happened in 1980 for all the numbers to match up. Logic defines that Snubbs and Peggy Bienvenu had to have won it, as they were the Rallye Masters for the next year's event. Speaking of that event, the 4th annual rally in 1981 was held around Metairie and River Ridge. Winning that rallye was Rodger and Fran Tally, who's November 7th 1982 event (the 5th annual) took the entrants over the river to the west bank of St Charles Parish.

Snubbs and Peggy Bienvenu won the 1982 event and hosted the 6th annual in 1983, taking drivers over the "New" Lulling Bridge, a ferry ride back across the river (on a TSD rallye, what a novel concept), concluding in Laplace. Michael Cenac and Wayne Plaisance won the event and would be the host of the 7th annual in 1984. This rallye was titled "Tour De New Orleans East". I have no information on the winner of this event, or the 8th

annual in 1985.

November 9th 1986 marked the observance of the 9th annual EE Reynolds Memorial Rallye. It started at Lakeside Mall, over the lake, through Covington and Folsum, and back over the Causway. Bob and Alice Hughes won the event, making them the rallye masters of the 10th annual rallye, held on November 8th 1987. The rallye focused on crossing water eight times, it was won by Tim Flannery, as he proudly documented in the results of the next event.



The 11th E. E. Reynolds Memorial Rallye, held November 6, 1988 by the Rally Master team of Tim Flannery and Kathie Winter. It was won by the proud team of Gary and Jane Walker, visiting from England. The 12th annual rally, held November 4th 1989, was run by Mike Loden, second place winners from the year before. Roger and Carol Gibson won the event and re-started the chain into the 1990's.




Baton Rouge Gathering by Rick Huber, BMCNO Vice President

Bob McAnelly showed us a new Jaguar XK140 book by Bernard Viart that he has just purchased. The book contains intricately detailed drawings of every component on the car showing every nut, bolt, wire, and fastener, drawings that began from electronic photographs converted into drawings. It was the most detailed Little British Car book any of us have ever seen, and for \$100, a bargain. Bob doesn't know if this type of book is being planned for any other Marques or Models, but it would certainly be a great benefit for any of us restoring these cars. The guest speaker for the evening was Tom Miller who gave us an update on the NOLA Motorsports Track in Avondale. Construction is about half way completed for an opening in October. sounds like a tremendous facility for luxurious auto driving and racing enthusiasts and will hopefully pique the interest in motorsports in the area.




