E.E. Reynolds Memorial Rallye Remembered by BMCNO Secretary Chad C. Wicker



Our club was founded in early 1977 by a MG enthusiast, Eldridge E. Reynolds and his wife Diana. They moved to North Louisiana in the fall of the same year, though the club continued.

In November of 1978 driving his Chevelle in North Louisiana, Eldridge was killed in an accident. That same year, the club decided to hold an annual Rallye to honor him.

The 23rd Annual Rallye in 2000 is a mystery that hopefully someone in the club can enlighten us on. Keith Vezina was the winner, and the 24th in 2001. The rally was a re-run of a rally held 8-10 years before and was a question and answer rallye, with information to be collected, and mystery questions at the end. Mike Anderson was the Rallye Master of the 25th annual EERMR held on November 3rd, 2002, being the winner of the 24th rallye even with a flat tyre. The route meandered through Covington, up to Folsom, across to Abita Springs, then down to finish at Rip's Seafood Restaurant on the lakefront back in Mandeville. Many entrants had to use the "emergency" envelope to get the address of the final checkpoint. Roy Richardson & Bill Coskrey, the winner, threatened to make the next rallye a tour of all his rental properties in New Orleans. He joked that the next rallye will cover all the housing projects in the city!

Roy didn't live up to the threat and planned an endurance rallye for the 26th annual EERMR on November 2nd 2003, starting at the Old Joe's Crab Shack, over the Causeway to the Northshore. Joy Watts and Lyle Brown, first time participants took home the cup. Joy was determined to may the 27th annual event's clues not too difficult and a shorter route. On November 7th 2004, the rallye began at the Italian Pie on Jefferson Highway,

through Avondale, Luling, Sarpy, finishing up at Airline Motors Restaurant in La Place. Rodger and Fran Talley finished in first place. For the 28th annual running of the EERMR was held on November 13th 2005, a mere 76 days after Katrina made landfall and 54 days after re-entry to the area was allowed. The fact that this event even happened is a testament to the resiliency of our club and members. The Rallye itself sent participants through Boutte, Luling, Des Allemands, Bayou Gouche, Kramer, finishing at Spahr's Restaurant in downtown Thibodeaux, with Mike Anderson and Herb Forsyth taking the trophy.

The 29th annual rallye on November 5th 2006 started at the Italian Pie on Jefferson Highway, crossed the Huey Long Bridge, the West Bank, Crescent City Connection finishing at Fellini's Cafe on Carrollton Avenue. Along the way, answers to numerous questions had to be found. Roger and Donna Nagy prevailed and put on the 30th annual running of the rallye on November 4th 2007. That rallye, the "Picture Perfect Rallye", started in Mandeville, through the North Shore, ending at the Abita Brew Pub. Each team was presented with a set of general instruction, a set of route instructions and three pages of photographs of scenes of interest which may or may not occur along the route. The object of the rallye was to follow the instructions and (Continued on page 6)



record the mileage to the nearest 1/100th mile at which each photograph was taken. Dave Hayden and Fred Stokes came with the intention of winning to bring the rallye closer to his home and succeeded!

For the 31st annual EERMR, Dave and Fred held the rallye on November 2nd 2008 in Houma, La, and featured two trips thru the tunnel under the intercoastal waterway. This rallye was a time, speed, distance run with 6 questions and pictures thrown in for extra points. Robert Rougelot and

Josh Kentzel won the rallye.

Extenuating circumstances forced the 32nd running to slide from 2009 into 2010 and beyond. Rallyes are an important part of British Car history and hopefully the 2011 running of the E. E. Reynolds Memorial Rallye will re-establish the tradition.

EE Reynolds Rallye 2011 by BMCNO Treasurer Don Marpe



You have read the history of the Reynolds Rally in the previous newsletters and now you have a chance to make history. The 2011 Reynolds Rally will be held on Saturday November 5 and start at 9:00 am. Each of the four Brit-

ish Motoring Club Groups will select a starting point for the event. New Orleans Group will start at the Kenner Welcome Center. Baton Rouge Group will start at the Shopping Center parking lot. North Shore Group will start at Abita Brew House. Lafayette Group will start at the Waffle House next to I-10.

Each British Car will be given an instruction packet that includes a Google map of the route to be followed, Google driving directions, and a sheet to record the travel times. There will be a two to five minute break between the start of each car so there is no follow the leader temptations. The map will show destinations along the route that the navigator needs to record the time they arrive at that destination. The goal of the event is to match the Google driving times and the winner will be the car that is closest to the exact time for all destinations.

The final destination for all of the cars is the Circuit Grand Bayou Race Track (www.circuitgrandbayou.com). The owners of the track are going to let us all take touring laps around the race track. These laps will not exceed legal speed limits by much, so no special equipment will be required. There will be a safety inspection of each car before they are allowed on the track and we will all sign insurance release forms.

After the touring laps, we will all go to the local favorite restaurant Café Lafourche that we passed along the route. The real purpose of the event is to drive your little British Car on some scenic roads and have fun. Let's all have some fun and make history together.

"Britts By The River" in Natchez

Sixteen BMCNO members ate at King's Tavern on Saturday evening after the show.

King's Tavern is one of the oldest buildings in Natchez, Mississippi - if not the oldest itself - and was built sometime in the latter 1700s. Along with being a tavern and inn, it was also the city's first post office. Richard King, owner of the tavern, was a prominent man in Natchez of that day.


There is a notorious side to the restaurant, though. In the 1930s, workers were expanding the fireplace and tore out the chimney wall. They found a space behind the wall that contained the skeletal remains of three bodies: two men and one woman. Laying on the floor was a jeweled dagger, which was assumed to have been used in their demise.

The woman is thought to have been Madeline, Richard King's mistress. As the story goes, when his wife found out about the affair, she had Madeline killed and bricked into the fireplace in the main dining room. Who the two male skeletons are is anyone's guess... much of the supernatural mischief today is blamed on Madeline, however.

"1st Annual EAA Baton Rouge Fly In" by BMCNO Vice President Rick Huber



It was a beautiful day for flying or driving on September 17 for the 1st annual Baton Rouge chapter of the Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) Fly In. Hard to beat the combination of cars and planes for a guy's day out.

There were about 40 aircraft on the ramp, from two tiny single person helicopters all the way up in size to the New Orleans Hornets Boeing 727, with plenty of interesting ones in between. Dr. Hippolite Landry was there with his Ercoupe, a 50's looking single engine, twin tail airplane. Dr. Landry achieved some fame in 1969 when he flew a single-engine airplane around the world in 23 days, which at the time was a world record. It happened to be Dr. Landry's 85th birthday, so a presentation and cake were part of the festivities.

Two WWII airplanes were the most interesting, a North American P-51 Mustang owned and flown by Don Weber, and a German Focke-Wulf FW 190 owned and flown by Don Hansen. There were many home built airplanes in addition to many light production aircraft. A Beechcraft King Air twin turboprop and a Dassault Falcon 100 twin turbojet, both locally owned private airplanes, are piloted by club member Bob Davis. Another interesting airplane was a Czechoslovakian Albatros L-39 jet trainer used by Soviet and several other air forces.

Will Steen, president of EAA chapter 244 here in

Baton Rouge welcomed us all talked about finally starting this event in Baton Rouge, the first annual. Among other things, he thanked BMCNO and Bob Davis for our participation with our Little British Car display in the parking lot. 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
