13. Have all past newsletters on the website. ALL newsletters from the beginning of the club are posted on line. We are still missing a few of the older newsletters. Please checkout the website. Thanks to Chad and Ronald for their continued hard work on this activity. 14. Establish community service projects sponsored by the club for non-profit organizations. The club added a new community service project for the Battered Women's Clinic. Two large bags of hotel amenities were delivered to the Battered Women's Clinic. Also, 165 pounds of food were delivered to the Second Harvesters Food Bank after the Christmas Party.

15. "Show & Tell" at all club meetings. This was conducted at one meeting on the South Shore. This should be added to all satellites a couple of times a the year.



E.E.Reynolds Rallye 2011 by Don Marpe



You have read the history of the E.E. Reynolds Rallye and the invitation to this year's rallye in the previous newsletters. Now we have one more rallye to add to the record book. There were 15

cars that took part in the rallye this year and they



all ended up at the right destination. The Baton Rouge Group had one car, the North Shore Group had 2 cars, the Lafayette Group had 5 cars and the New Orleans group had 7 cars. They all started out at locations in their area and followed the Google Map driving directions to pass through Donaldsonville in route to the final destination of the Circuit Grand Bayou Race Track. People in Donaldsonville must have thought the British had invaded their town with all of the little British Cars passing through.

Once all of the cars arrived at the race track, the track manager held a brief Drivers Meeting to discuss the safety rules and expectations for the touring laps. The cars were staged like real race cars and the "Start your engines" command was given. The race control starter waived the cars out after the lead car (which happened to be a Ferrari) took off to set the pace. The first lap was at a normal driving pace to allow the tires and brakes to warm up. The following laps were described by one driver as spirited. After approximately 30 minutes, the checkered flag was waived and the cars came off the track. The discussions among the drivers right after they got out of their cars made it clear that this was their favorite part of the event. The discussion was so lively, that everyone had to be forced to leave the track to go to lunch. When members of the Big Meal Club have to be forced to go eat, they must have been having fun.

The cars caravanned to Café Lafourche where lunch was served. During the lunch, Bonnie Marpe (the independent accounting firm representative) tabulated the results. 

If You Thought The Reynold's Ralley Was Fun, Just Wait



Part of the Reynolds Ralley Event was to take "Touring Laps" around the Circuit Grand Bayou Race Track. The lap speed was determined by a lead car from the race track and was described as spirited by some drivers and leisurely by others. So what if you could determine your own speed around this race track. The club is working on setting up "Lapping Days" with the Circuit Grand Bayou staff that would let you drive your car as fast as you dare or just have some more Touring Laps. This would be less controlled so the drivers would need to meet the race tracks safety requirements. That means that your car would need to meet the Tech Inspection requirement and you would need a certified helmet. The cost for an afternoon (two or three 20 minute sessions) of driving would be \$75. For more info on the requirements, go to <u>www.circuitgrandbayou.com</u> and look at Lapping / Solo Time Trials.
