Before dinner members enjoyed what they said was the best Mint Juleps served in the bar area. Dinner was served in the Grand Ballroom and included a 4 course meal. Ronda gave us a history of not only the house but also the furnishings, ghosts, and past and present owners of the plantation. Dinner was followed up by the men smoking cigars on the veranda and ladies in my room gossiping and laughing.



Sunday morning started with a "Southern Breakfast" in the dining area. Our next stop was **Vicksburg National Military Park**. We started at the Visitor's Center with a 20 minute video on the Siege of Vicksburg and artifacts from the siege. local Chevy club who talked about the April Fools Day Cruise to Port Hudson on Sunday, April 1. Otherwise it was a bunch of us regulars talking about all our British car and other happenings while we ate dinner at Cafe Americain. Once the meeting got underway, we talked about the Vicksburg weekend, the goody bag party, particularly the Bullitt scene that Rick had to watch until the Charger goes up in flames for the 43rd time before they had to leave for a granddaughter play in Baton Rouge. 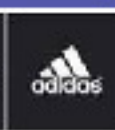
