Thanks to everyone that came out to welcome and participate with our guests.





The Barn Find That Wasn't, Part IV – Justice Prevails by Rick Huber, Vice President BMCNO



Yes, I know it's been over a year since I wrote Part III of this story. I've had a few requests to find out what happened, but very few. I apologize to those of you who read the first three parts and then were

left wondering. I ran into an issue of not knowing how to finish the story. I think I've resolved that now, so here goes. Thanks Bill.

If you haven't read the first three parts and are interested, they're in the Nov & Dec 2010 and April 2011 issues of the Morris Gazette. Part III of my quest to buy a "barn find" 1956 Austin-Healey 100 ended like this: I received a message while praying during our 3 to 4 am adoration hour in October 2009. The message told me how to find the lady I had charged with felony theft in July when the police couldn't. Later that morning, I visited my local Capital One Bank and told the manager the story how I got stiffed after paying for the car. I remembered that Debra trusted my personal check because we both banked with Capital One, and thought she might still have her account with them. She did. The branch manager said if I gave her a copy of the arrest warrant, they'd put a note in Debra's file, detain her if she came in, and have her arrested. I went straight to the Sheriff's office to get a copy of the warrant, and on the way back, the branch manager called

to say she was detained in New Orleans. I got there in 5 minutes, the branch manager called New Orleans, who then called the police. They arrived a few minutes later and cuffed her. Debra was in custody, 6 months after scamming me, and 3 months since I last heard from her while she was on the lam, less than 12 hours after my message. Prayer works!

The assistant DA I worked with said she denied the charges and a court date was scheduled a few months later. During those few months I visited another club member, and told him the story of my lost barn find. To my amazement, he said he had it. Debra had sold it to him, must be about the time her communication with me got suspicious, and he was the one who towed it away from her house that week I was on vacation in June 2009. He offered to testify against her if it came to that, but she had his money, he had the title and the car, and that was that. Possession in this case was the full 10/10ths.

I reflected back to the hectic, euphoric time trying to close the deal. Once she got the title in her name from DMV (not sending it to Peter like she told me she had), she must have decided to stiff me and sell it to somebody else for almost double what I paid. It turns out that this club member had tried to buy the car from Debra's father some years before, just the way that Peter's friend Daniel had, and she must have found his contact information and a higher price he had offered

while she was looking for the title. So I acted irrationally buying the car without the title because I was afraid of losing it to Peter's friend the Healey dealer, and then I ended up losing it to somebody I knew right here in Baton Rouge. The obvious moral of that story, don't act irrationally. I could have waited for the title and risked losing the car, which would have saved me money and plenty of heartache. In this Little British Car world, another one will come along, there'll always be another chance.

When Debra had her day in court a few months

later, she denied the charge and the story, but I had provided the assistant DA a notebook full of documentation – my own written story, transcripts of texts, pictures of the car in her driveway, the copy of the registration she gave me, a copy of the check I gave her, and the name and contact information of the club member who purchased the car after I did. Guilty! The judge ordered her to pay restitution of \$100/month, so I started getting my money back. The mystery of what happened to the car was solved, and I learned a painful lesson about trusting people even in our normally friendly and trusting Little British Car world.

BMCNO at NOLA Motorsports Park by Don Marpe



On Saturday April 28, 2012, there was a fleet of Little British Cars speeding around the 2.75 mile race track at the new NOLA Motorsport Park. Although the laps were called "Parade Laps" there were a couple of little cars

that had every horse in their engine sweating hard. Of course there were some cars and drivers that wanted more, but that was for another day. Nine BMCNO club members were at the event and they brought along another six guests.



The group arrived around 11:00 and spent some time just talking cars and looking at the facilities from the parking lot. Everyone was impressed with the top quality of all of the facilities. Marie Roussel was our gracious host and we thank her for setting up the facilities. Wes Ratcliff gave us the history of the facility and talked about upcoming events. Scott Foremaster is the track's Driver Education Supervisor and he explained the safety



rules for the Parade Laps. Marcos Zervigon was the track representative that helped set up the whole event. Wes told the group that the North track is the first phase of the total complex development and the South track will add another 2.8 miles of road. The North track has a front straightaway that is over half a mile long. There were 16 turns and even on the Parade Laps you could get a feel for how much fun it would be to drive at your limits on this track.

There are several buildings already completed at the facility that house garages for NOLA Motorsport Park members and for those that want to rent the space. There is an office complex, visitor's center and the Kart Center. The main event center is still under construction, but when it is completed will have Stanley's Restaurant and areas to host meetings and other events. For those technical guys,

Wes talked about the preparation of the site before the buildings and roads when in. His chest got big when he started to talk about the race





track itself. Before the first section of black top was put down, the native soil was mixed with fly ash (calcium and lime) to change the Louisiana marsh into a stable and solid surface. Then it was time to start laying the many layers of asphalt. It was not just any asphalt either. An expert in asphalt was brought in to help select the gravel. Not just any gravel would work either. It could not be the round rock that you normally see, it had to have sharp edges so that once it was mixed with the black stuff and placed on the ground, it would not move like you see on some of our roads. All total there were 3 layers of asphalt put down. Wes answered some questions from the group and then we headed for our cars.

All the cars followed Scott and he set the speed for the group. Even at 40 mph, some of the corners caused a few British tires to squeal in excitement or was it terror. We were able to make five laps around the track and then retired to the parking



lot to discuss how fast we could have gone if Scott had just let us and to ask more questions. It is an amazing track and it is likely that some of us will return in the future to really exercise our engines.



Kart racing sounds like kids stuff until you get into the kart. Three of the members Roger, Keith and Don tested our driving skills in the karts and found Keith's skills to be the best. Your first thought is to give it the gas and zoom around the corners. We quickly learned that this was not kids stuff. It takes real driving skill to get around the track without spinning and still not get passed by other hot shots. After the first 10 minute session (\$25 per session) we were convinced that a second session was for another day. Those club members that drove the karts or watch those that did went to the snack bar on the second floor of the Kart Center where we watched the rookies try to match our skill and lap times.

Club members that attended were Mike Lewis and his wife Sharon, Alan Bradley and his wife Sue, Keith Vezina, Roger Nagy, Wally Friloux, Robert Rougelot, Dave Stiebel, and Don Marpe.

Everyone that attended was impressed with the facilities and planned to come back again if not to use the track, then to just be part of the car community. On the last Sunday of every month, NOLA Motorsport Park has what they call Krewe Du Vroom. It is typically an open car show (just







bring your car and park it – no cost – no pre arrangements needed) in the morning and some special event after that. There are Parade Laps around the track at set times. The Sunday after our event was the first time the track held the event and there were over 100 cars on display that seemed to come and go. When a parking spot in the display area opened up, another car from the big parking lot moved in the open spot. There



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
