CRUSIN' THE COAST- The British Invasion



For years now BMCNO has been missing what may be the best car event in the South: Cruisin' The Coast. We have plans to change that

this year.

Now I know what you're thinking- that's a hot rod show, right? Well, no, and yes. The fact is that Cruisin' has over 5000 registered participants. That is not a typo, five thousand cars! If you can think of a genre of classic car, it is there, everything from restored Model T Fords to the Back to the Future DeLorean and everything in between.

Cruisin' is a week-long event that stretches from Bay St. Louis to Ocean Springs. There are venues up and down the coast to park and meet with fellow enthusiasts. Just driving the coast during the week is as close as you can come today to driving with the same cars that would have been around when our cars were new. Please visit the website and see for yourself all the activities to choose from. http://crusinthecoast.com

There is an entry fee of \$50 if you pre-register before August 15. For your money you get a T-shirt, access to all the venues, discount coupons for dinner at local restaurants, entry to the swap meet and a host of other goodies, plus and most importantly, a place to park at any of the venues up and down the coast. With your package, you get a placard that you are encouraged to get stamped at the various Cruise sites. After completing this card and returning it to Cruise Central, you will be entered to win one of 50, \$500 door prizes! Registration price increases to \$75 after August 15.

Some of the venues are more conducive to group activities than others. At Cruise central (Gulfport) the site of the old VA is ideal with lots of grass parking area and trees for shade; it would not be difficult to assemble as a group at this location. Edgewater Mall (Biloxi) is plenty roomy enough for groups, and D'Iberville likewise. They are however parking lots and can be quite hot. Ocean Springs and Bay St, Louis are tougher to keep a large group together as the venue is the downtown area and the parking is along the streets. Having said that they are each worth a visit as the lineup on the old town streets is spectacular. Bay St. Louis has a secondary site at the old train depot with plenty of parking and shade.

The members of the BMCNO Gulf Coast chapter will be participating in events all week. On Thursday we will cruise the entire coast from Bay St Louis to Ocean Springs and back in order to get our passes stamped. We plan to find a spot to eat along the way, and will likely spend some time in downtown Ocean Springs. Sometime in the afternoon we will arrive back at cruise central with our filled cards.

BMCNO is planning to assemble en-masse at the Gulfport VA (aka cruise central) on Saturday the 13th. There is plenty of food on site and there are live bands all day at the stage on the grounds. In the afternoon we will cruise down Hwy. 90 to Bay St. Louis and drive through the downtown venue. We will regroup at the train depot and then head off for dinner.

Keep in mind that these 'sites' and 'venues' are blockaded and only registered cruisers can drive thru. That doesn't mean you can't visit, but all non participants must park outside the venue and walk - no fun for driving enthusiasts ;-) Guest parking is quite distant in Bay St. Louis and Ocean Springs.

He also found a YouTube video of that same race. Pretty amazing historical stuff. Anyway, we could probably get pictures together and make an archive of some of the racing in this area in those days. Tom H. asked if anybody remembered the Harding Field races in Baton Rouge. Tom M. said yes, he actually crewed that race. We tried to figure out what year that was, but only were able to narrow it down to the mid-60s. If anybody's interested in heading up a picture archive project like that, please let Rick know.

Why the Un-Car Show by Cathy Greensfelder Reprint August 2010 Gazette





Richard Wolf had been a member since 1996 and wanted to get more involved. He volunteered to put on the event. He found the restaurant, arranged for them to open just for us, arranged for a prix fixe menu, got the street blocked off, bought ribbons.

Bill Breithoff found the "Goodwill Trophy". We tell everyone it's named after the store where we got it but really, Bill dug it out of the back of a closet and artistically broke it!! Bill at-tached a piece of duct tape to the back and inscribed the winner in black permanent marker. The trophy was awarded to the car most in need of total restoration, with the understanding that the loving cup would be returned the following year to be passed on to the next winner.

Then we hoped folks would come and enter their cars and not get mad if they got an award. And they did! In fact, people competed for the "awards". During the first couple Un-Car Shows, Roy Richardson taped a yard stick to the side of his TR8 so the judges could see how long the dent was. Charlie Ake hauled his car in on a trailer, no engine, no interior, no top ... Dave Hayden wanted to participate but just couldn't face driving in from Abbeville (three and a half hours) in August without A/C. So he drove his red Miata. And brought a life-size, cardboard yellow TR6 facade that he put on the side of the Miata. The cut-out car had real TR6 hub caps and side mirror. (We gave him a certificate for "most in need of being real"!! Peter Braun started out from Bay St Louis in his British car, but it broke down just a few miles out. He had it towed home and came in his Japanese car. We wrote modified a Participation Award certificate to be a Non-Participation Award for him. When New Orleans was evacuated for Hurricane Katrina, Ronnie Palmisano made sure he took the Goodwill trophy with him so it wouldn't be lost in the storm!!



Richard Wolf, instrumental in creating this event, passed away in April of 2000. In memory of his passing, the UnCar Show was renamed the Richard Wolf Annual UnCar Show, continuing the tradition of honoring those members that have gone before that were instrumental in making the club what it is today.



Delgado Tech Session – Alignment Basics by Don Marpe





What was advertised as a technical session on front end alignment turned out to be much more for the eleven BMCNO members that attended. Delgado instructor Billy Gray and his ace student John ?

did a great job of giving the attendees the basics of alignment. Chamber is the angle of the wheels top to bottom and is normally slightly negative. Caster is the angle of the wheel forward to back and is also normally slightly negative. This was interesting to the attendees but not very useful since it is not adjustable on most of their cars. Toe in is the angle that the tires are from front to back. The normal setting is slightly negative (ie pigion toed) or the tires pointing slightly to the middle of the road. This is adjustable on the British Cars so it was of great value to the attendees. In fact it was extremely valuable to Robert Barback whose MG had over 20 degrees of toe in and it should be less than 1.

Pete Weber talked to Billy while most of the attendees went out to put their tops up and wash their hands after eating several donuts. He suggested that the group was more interested in putting their cars on the alignment rack then talking more about the engineering of it, so off we went.

OJ Williams was the first to put his Triumph on

the rack. His car had frame rusting issues and he had welded several new frame pieces on the car, so he was very interested in how the alignment ended up. It turned out to be pretty close to the specifications once we found out what they were supposed to be. Steve Lindsley was next with his MG. It also looked pretty good. Danny Varnado was next with his modified MG. An interesting point was Danny's car showed 6 deg positive caster on each wheel, and Billy and John thought that was too much. We started talking about how to adjust it with shims mounting the front suspension cross member to the frame. Then Bob Barback got his green MGB manual out, and sure enough, it showed 7 deg positive caster as the cor-



rect specs, so no problem. Danny had asked the question why the steering on his MGB was so sensitive compared to other cars, and Billy said the positive caster in addition to the rack and pinion steering was what does it.

As expected, his alignment was pretty close to specs. Bob Barback was next with his MG. He has not owned the car very long and just before he purchased it, the owner had gotten the front wheel rims swapped so the knock off hubs were now turning the wrong direction and were able to work themselves loose as the car was driven. The end result was both front wheels came off and the car coasted to a stop on the brake rotors. This re-

sulted in the purchase price dropping, but did not help the front end alignment at all. You can see from the before pictures of the alignment machine display, that his car was way off from the slightly



negative toe in desired. John "Ace Student" was nice enough to make some adjustments so that the toe in was closer (see the after pictures) but during the process discovered other front end issues. Bob has some bushings that were worn out and needed to be replaced. After that was done, he could get a proper front end alignment.

The last car on the rack was Gordon "Ham" Ramsey's Avanti. He knew that he had front end issues because his tires would shimmy when he



took a corner fast. It did not take long for John and Phil to identify that there was a problem. Even Ronnie notices things were moving that

should not move when you shake the wheel. It took a while to identify the real issues but Ham took them in stride. When someone suggested it may be time to sell, Ham just shook his head no. It is all part of the fun of owning cars that are special.



I subscribe to "Hemmings Sports & Exotic Car" magazine. Every issue has several articles and features that I find very interesting and thumbing through the December 2011 issue an article on

page 88 brought back some rather fond memories that I thought I might share.

When I graduated from college, I started an automotive electrical repair business that catered to foreign car repair shops. The idea was simple, most repair shops at the time could not find the talent to efficiently diagnose and repair electrical problems. I could step in, perform the work, charge the shop, and they could in turn, mark up the repair as they felt necessary and service the customer. Apparently the idea was a little ahead of its time (glass companies do all of the time now) because only a couple of shops went for the idea.

As a result, I was looking for some other ways to fortify my income. Someone told me about a guy restoring an Alfa Romeo in the back of a Snow Ball machine manufacturing place in town. I stopped by and after being checked out to make sure I wasn't someone going to shut the operation down was allowed in the very back of the building (the storage area) to find an English guy named Paddy working on a pre-war Alfa Romeo 6C2500 Cabriolet. In addition to that, he had several Austin Healy's, MGA's & other British cars that needed to be restored. I had found the mother lode of cars to restore and was very excited. I explained that I had paid for college repairing and restoring these types of cars and would love to help restore these cars. He agreed and explained that he was fixing them up to make complete running cars

that started and stopped and sending them back to England for enthusiast to buy and start performing their own proper restorations on them.

One of the cars that piqued my interest was what appeared to be a right hand drive Austin Healy 100/4 with a badge stating "Austin of England" on the trunk lid (boot lid?) and several badges on the lower right front fender (wing?). The car had no engine or transmission and as the story goes, was supposed to be an American V8 recipient from some guy in Texas who apparently made a name for himself putting V8's in LBC's. Fortunately, he left this car alone after pulling out the engine and transmission. Paddy had a newer 100/4 engine and transmission that he settled on after not being able to find an older engine and 4 speed with 1st gear locked out and overdrive that originally came with the car.

After some convincing, Paddy decided to start putting this car together. Right away we noticed that this car was not like other 100/4's that any of us worked on. For instance, the car had 4 wheel disk brakes. Now we all knew that 100/S's had 4 wheel disk brakes but they all had Girling and these were Dunlop. The front of the car still had a 100/4 grill and we also noticed that the hood (bonnet) was louvered and held with a strap but back in the day any boy racer could have done that.

After consulting with my father we started investigating the badges on the "wing" and found out that they were from hill climb events in England and discovered that hill climb events were attended by up and coming and experienced racers to improve and hone their skills for the track.

He wanted to see the car for himself and after getting clearance brought him over. He was awe struck and determined that it may be some sort of prototype as it looked like a 100/M with 100/S fea-





tures but had several unusual things about it. We started to perform a "sympathetic" restoration on the car which means that you keep as much of the original "patina" of the car as possible.

My father took some time off of work and was able to knock out all of the dents to the body without further damaging the paint or anything else.

Paddy offered him an unrestored Elva Courier that had to be picked up in Alabama with a shovel and flatbed as payment.

Well, this Austin Healy was built sometime in the early 1950's and any racing history buff knows about what happened at Le Mans in 1955 with Austin Healey and Mercedes Benz. Briefly, Austin Healey's entry was hit by Pierre Levegh's magnesium bodied Mercedes Benz 300SLR which launched into the grandstands hitting a water fountain and bursting into flames killing Levegh and over 80 spectators.

That was the last factory sponsored Mercedes race car until the 90's. This event left Austin Healey without a car to finish the season. Lance Macklin (Austin Healy's race director) was driving the test mule that he used to help develop the 100/S as a personal car taking it to hill climbs, getting groceries and such and decided that it could finish the race season as the factory entry. So our little car found its way on the paddock for the last race of the season at Sebring.

Back then at the end of the season, used factory race cars were about as valuable as termites to a house and were dumped off on anyone that showed interest.

We found out that the Texan who happened to be "attending" the race with a racer friend bought the car to race privately, found it too slow and decided to replace the engine and transmission with some V8 power when he started developing race cars with some interesting features such as fansthat would suck the air from under the car to provide more grip. That feature was so efficient that the rulebooks were rewritten stating that fans could not be used to suck cars to the track.

As a result, all modern race cars use spoilers that produce so much down force they can be driven upside down on the roof of a tunnel. The man in question was no other than Jim Hall. The cars that he developed were known as Chaparral's and his friend was Carroll Shelby, the man that put a V8 in a LBC.


