October is almost upon us and the time for invasion is here. Come

While it is a week long affair, and you are welcome to attend any or all (not possible) events, we are scheduling group activities for Thursday through Saturday. Here is a schedule of what we have on tap:

Thursday 11th. Oct. -- We will meet in the Dunbar Village parking lot in Bay St. Louis (corner of Dunbar Ave. and Hwy. 90) at 9 AM. We will leave the lot at 9:15 SHARP. We'll take the service road to the foot of the BSL bridge and cross over Hwy. 90 to drive through old town Bay St. Louis. Those who are registered will get their ticket stamped for the prize drawing. After Cruisin' through old town we will come back to Dunbar village and pick up any latecomers or non-registered members for the next leg.

Once again leaving Dunbar, we will drive the beach to Cruise Central at the Gulfport VA. Any unregistered cars who would like to sign up can register at that time. This will be just a drive through unless someone needs to register, in which case the group will stop and wait.

Saturday 13th. Oct. -- 9AM We will gather at the Gulfport VA for a shady



This year's rallye is a drive north from Port Allen, Louisiana exploring scenic venues along the west bank of the Mississippi River.

The rallye will take about 2 hours and 30 minutes. The route is approximately 130 miles start to finish, but is still being "fine tuned" to stay within the desired total event time. Lunch will tentatively be at the Cash's Casino Restaurant (which allows minors) at the end of the event. The rallye is a modified Time-Distance-Speed event that will use mileage and time recorded at two checkpoints along the route and a final time and mileage at the finish. Speed is based on the


average speed of a test vehicle based upon the posted speed limits along the route. There will be an odometer check before reaching the first checkpoint.

There will be <u>no</u> need to do complex math. The mileage and elapsed time for each car, during each leg, will be recorded at each checkpoint by the rallye master. Each car will receive a "Panic Envelope" that contains a map of the route and how to get to the final stop.

To pass the time, a questionnaire asking about sites seen along the route is part of the fun and can be used for bonus points.
