

Adventures In Rallye Planning by Mike Baker



As you know, the winner of the previous year's E.E. Reynolds Rally has the dubious honor of planning the event for the current year. Think of the honor as a sort of a "no good deed goes unpunished".

For this year's event, I had wanted to have the route run south, with antebellum homes providing the scenery. Then along came Hurricane Isaac, and with it, reports of damage south of I-10 and damage stretching to the north bank of Lake Ponchatrain and above. It seemed best to change the proposed route. Dave Hayden and I sat down to "rough out" a route with an Atlas and off I went on September 15th to find a route. We moved the route west to Port Allen hoping to avoid the unknowns of post hurricane damage and flooding.

I found an interesting route that I think is both scenic and fun. So, the next weekend, September 22nd, Dave Hayden and I went back to the starting point in Port Allen and started following my notes seeking to verify mileages. We missed the odometer checkpoint and turned around to return to the start to zero the odometer trip meter and start again. I had put Dave behind the wheel of my XJS so I could use a camera, check the map and take notes. We came to a stop sign when Dave turned to me and said "there is no clutch!" After this "WTF" moment we started calling ICE members listed in the club membership directory.

Unfortunately, September 22nd was also the date for "Brits on the Bluff" in Natchez. We called for several ICE members before finally reaching Bob McAnelly who graciously came to the scene bring tools and assisted with locating a tow truck to bring us back to Breaux Bridge. Special thanks to Bob for helping us out of a tight spot. If you have ever been towed, you know that the typical tow truck driver is a "colorful" character. This one was no exception and we had an interesting ride to Breaux Bridge.

For those of you who are familiar with my XJS, you know that I had installed a 5-speed manual transmission conversion about eight years ago. The slave cylinder is an annulus type, essentially a donut with the transmission input shaft passing through the center hole. This style of slave cylinder has been the Achilles' heel of the conversion. Whenever I would contact the conversion kit supplier, I would find out that they no longer supply the earlier style and have changed to yet another type. After ordering a replacement slave cylinder, I put the car on jack stands and started pulling the transmission. By pure luck, I happened to grab onto one of the steering rack tie rod ends to pull myself on a creeper under the car only to find that the tie rod end had almost a 1/8" of play. In the second "WTF" moment in just a week, I ordered tie rod ends.

After installing the replacement slave cylinder and reinstalling the transmission, it was time to bleed the clutch. Although I had used Teflon on the threads of the nipples where the threads went into the slave cylinder, during bleeding, there was fluid dripping from the weep hole of the bell housing. In the third "WTF" moment I pulled the transmission down, again, tightened the nipples and buttoned everything back up.

My trusty assistant and better half; Linda, pumped and pumped the clutch pedal while I bled a never-ending stream of air from the slave cylinder. In what was now the fourth "WTF" moment, I determined that the Wilwood master cylinder had also failed. So, I ordered a

clutch master cylinder for a six cylinder 5-Speed XJS.

Apparently the XJS clutch was not enough of a challenge. The Wednesday before the October 6th FUNCANA, the fuel pump in my '94 pick-up failed. I had the second tow-truck ride in two weeks. Linda let me use her Honda Accord on Friday to buy parts for the truck, with the clear understanding that I had better not break her car. I came by FUNCANA after fixing the truck. One of the contestants is a student at LSU and told me that Saturday, November 3rd is the date of an Alabama-LSU game in Baton Rouge. After studying the situation for a few minutes, I noticed that the right rear tire was only about 2" above the garage floor, while the left rear was at lease 8" above the floor. On Independent Rear Suspension Jaguars, the rear differential, axles, etc. are mounted in a cradle that attaches to the car with four rubber mounts. Both right side mounts were broken. In what was now (how many was it?) the fifth "WTF" moment I found myself on the phone...again...ordering suspension mounts.

On Saturday, October 13th Dave Hayden and I found ourselves driving the rally course...in a Jaguar...but this time...in Menda Hayden's XJ8.

Finding a suitable restaurant proved to be yet another challenge. Perhaps overly optimistic, we thought that if we had ten cars participate, amounting to twenty people and fifteen cars would yield thirty, we needed a restaurant that could accommodate up to thirty people in addition to their normal crowd and that was open on Saturday at lunchtime. We were not asking much! We looked in New Roads, Port Allen and the surrounding area. We finally found the China Buffet at 4041 Hwy 1 in Port Allen. They have a large room. Dave and I ate lunch. It is not Commander's Palace, but it was OK and was what we could find. Garmin was of little help at all.




