Spring fever, March Madness, the Ides of March, St. Patrick's Day, excitement about the car show something in the air stirred the interests in 14 of us to get together at Cafe Americain on Tuesday, March 19th. It was the largest Baton Rouge

area gathering in some time, and better yet, we had four new faces in the crowd. Ray Rarey, a Chicagoan now working in Baton Rouge with a 2011 Jaguar XJL and an interest in all things Jaguar and Daron Johnston, son of members Pete & Lilly Johnston, and new owner of Tom Miller's MGB GT both attended for the first time and joined the club. Chris Brown, son of member Charlie Brown who is helping Dad get the '61 Healey 3000 that's been in the family 35 years back on the road will hopefully join the club soon. Don Powers, Baton Rouge native and a multi-marque, multi-model British car owner and long time friend of Tom Miller attended for the first time and also plans to join the club. It was great hearing from these new guys and their associations with people in the club and British cars, and we enthusiastically welcomed them to the group.

Rick talked about the plantation cruise with Reg reminding him of the names of the houses as he went through the story. Then Rick talked about the upcoming car show events and got a head count on those planning to attend, with most planning to at least attend the show. We organized a caravan to the show from the Home Depot on Highland Road with Marc Zebouni leading the group and leaving at 9 am on Saturday morning.

Marc talked about the Town Center Euro Fest

Bill Avery gave us the latest rendition of Auto Trivia - Fact or Fiction, with Tom Miller claiming the prize by answering one of the two questions correctly. Bill talked about an article he had found on a web site called Etceterini.com, a site run by Cliff Reuter dedicated to history, documentation, and preservation of small displacement Italian cars from the 40s and 50s. Come to find out, the article was about him (yes, our very own SOB (Same 'ol Bill) and his early racing days in the late 50's. Funny thing though was how factually inaccurate the article was - wrong cars, wrong years, wrong drivers, wrong races, whew, it read like fiction to one who had been there and done that. Like the girl with the French model boyfriend said, you can believe anything you read on the internet.

Show and tell was also contributed by Bill. It was a big Healey or E-type HD8 SU carburetor after Rick had asked about the fast idle choke mechanism not working on his Healey. Bill dug out and dusted off a spare carb from his parts locker and brought it in. Rick explained how the choke cable lifts the lever that turns the shaft that actuates the cam that pushes down the plate at the end of the second shaft that compresses the spring that allows the fast idle screw to increase the throttle opening to increase the idle speed when the choke cable is pulled out. Simple, huh? Now that he

could see it working on a carb right there at the dinner table, it would be easy for him to lubricate the ones in his car and get them to work again. Keep your fingers crossed that it works that easily.

Charlie talked about what he and Chris have been doing with the Healey lately, including that momentous occasion very recently when they fired it up for the first time in, Charlie said 15 years. Chris said, "come on Dad, it's been much longer than that. I'm 30 years old, and I can't ever remember that car running". So they agreed it was probably closer to 25 or 30 years. But start it did, and ran quite smoothly until the float bowls emptied. Making good progress for getting another one back on the road, congratulations Charlie & Chris.

Mike Loden talked about replacing the windshield seals in his AH 3000, the BJ7 model he's been restoring the last few years. He said he bought new seals from Moss and when he put the frame back together around the original windshield, they put so much pressure on the windshield that it cracked. Come to find out, Moss has gone to thinner replacement windshields and thicker seals, but you can't use the new seals with original On the other hand, according to windshields. Mike, Victoria British has stuck with original thickness windshields and seals, so you can replace seals and keep original windshields. Mike got a new Victoria British windshield and seals, and it all went back together very easily with no problems.

Daron will repaint the engine compartment in his just acquired MGB GT, and there ensued a lively conversation about preparing to paint after brake fluid has saturated some areas. Rick's horror story about repainting his MGB after silicone brake fluid leakage was recounted, but other stories about regular glycol brake fluid also were shared. Unperturbed, Darren will attempt the painting in the next few weeks, so we should hear about how that goes pretty soon.

Marc brought his just purchased, sight unseen on eBay, beautiful red '58 MGA to the meeting and talked about the buy and getting it in shape after having it shipped to Baton Rouge from Philadelphia. Like the auction comments say, "well bought!". 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

Leaving Laura Plantation it was back to our time, 2013, and back to the reality of the upcoming Annual







Chef's Corner by Karen Murray



Green Lima Beans & Shrimp in a Roux By Pete Webber This is one of my personal all time favorites. Whenever Pete brings this dish to an event, I never get the opportunity to have some.

4-6 strips bacon or ¼ lb. smoked sausage (cut small)

2 or 3 Tbsp. bacon fat or oil from frying sausage Flour

1 cup diced onion

- 2-5 cloves garlic minced
- 1 lb. frozen Lima Beans

1-14oz. can tomatoes (chopped)

1 lb. medium shrimp (Peeled)

Seasonings (sale, pepper, bay leaf, thyme, mint, or parsley)

In a large heavy sauce pan, sauté bacon or sau-

sage until lightly browned. Remove bacon or sausage with a slotted spoon and add flour to make a light roux with the drippings. Add onions, garlic, and lima beans. Mix well and add enough water to cover mixture about ½ inch above the vegetables.

Stir in seasonings, tomatoes, bacon or sausage, add shrimp. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat and simmer, covered, and cook until beans become tender (20 to 30 minutes).

Serve over rice and enjoy.


