- 1 bottle of Abita Amber


- Box of 2 Alarm Chili

### Vintage Car Races and BMCNO Little British Cars

satisfy that desire by installing a roll cage, swap
those smooth riding shock

absorbers for some Koni adjustable shocks, put some fat racing slicks on your wheels, buy a helmet and gloves, and head out to the NOLA Motorsport Park for some fast laps. If that seems a pretty big first step, you may want to try an auto cross event.

BMCNO Board Members have checked into setting up an auto cross event at the NOLA Motorsport Park for the club. Unfortunately, the cost to host an event is too expensive for the expected attendance. The auto cross pad at NOLA rents for \$1,100 per day and even a half day rental is more than the club can justify. During the investigation into the auto cross event, the NOLA representative introduced the board to another club with similar interests. That club "The New Orleans Classic Auto Racing (NOCAR) group" is setting up an auto cross event and has invited BMCNO members to attend. The event is scheduled for Saturday June 1, 2013. It will start at 10:00 and last until the evening. The cost for the auto cross is \$25 but that includes (you guessed it) barbeque at the end of the event. In addition to the auto cross, the cars that did all of that stuff above to be able to really race will be on the real race track.

NOCAR realizes that this is pretty short notice on the event, so attendance may be limited (especially since BMCNO already had a tech session at Delgado planned for the morning). They plan to

The NOCAR auto cross is described as a "low impact" auto cross. If you are not familiar with auto cross events, imagine you are in your car with no special equipment (no helmet, gloves, roll cage, etc) required. You are at the starting line and the staging manager gives you the green flag. You give that little British Car the gas and go straight down the auto cross pad (really big parking lot) until you hit 50 mph. Then you hit the brakes because you have to make a sweeping turn around to go back the other way. Then you give it the gas again, but this time the turn is not so sweeping. You give it the gas again, but there are all of these cones that you have to swerve around to get to the other end. You make another hard turn and go back through some more cones that seem to be getting closer and closer together. After the last cone, you hit the finish line. Although it seems like you were on the track for hours, the stop watch says it was only 2 minutes and 30 seconds.

For future events, this type of auto cross would be a great way to compare the cars we all have and provide a low risk way for members to try out other members cars. 
