Site Preparation / Parking / Traffic — This group already has lots of help signed up and those workers mark the field so the cars park in the right area and directs the cars when they come to the show.

Transportation / Show Car Pickup — The fun part of this job is to pick up the new Jags, Range Rovers, Mini Coopers that get displayed at the show. The work part of this is making sure goodie bag stuff, donations, PA equipment, other stuff get to the show area when needed.



event will be an enjoyable drive through New Orleans to see some of the more notable landmarks.

The Rallye will start at Delgado College near the parking lot used as an entrance for the car show. If the parking lot gates are closed, the cars will line up along the road. The first car will start the event at 10:00 with the next car starting a few minutes later. The event including a lunch at Parkway Bakery and Tavern will be over around 1:30.

Starting point – Delgado College Parking Lot Start Time

Exit parking lot and turn right onto Orleans / Marconi Avenue. Continue to City Park Avenue and turn left at the light.

Follow City Park Avenue to the entrance to the New Orleans Museum of Art. Turn into the museum entrance and take the path to the right of the museum. Continue right over the bridge to landmark #1 (Christian Brothers School) on the right.



Take a left after the landmark and keep making left turns until you get to Golf Drive. Turn left and follow Stadium Drive. You will pass by landmark #2 (Tad Gormley Stadium).

Meander around Victory Avenue and Dreyfous Drive to see the sites. Continue on Dreyfous Drive until you spot landmark #3 (Morning Call). Park your car and take a 15 minute beignet break. As verification that you did not skip this stop, you will be checked for powdered sugar on your clothes at the end of the rally.

After the break, follow Dreyfous Drive out of the

park and get on Esplanade Avenue going toward the city. You will soon pass landmark #4 (St Louis Cemetery). If you want to take a short detour, turn left on Broad Street and

then a left on Gentilly until you see Landmark #5 (Fair Grounds Race Track). You can stop and place a bet on the horses or hear some great Jazz (depending on the time of the year).

Turn right on Decatur and continue past landmark #6 (French Market). If your craving for beignets has not been satisfied, feel free to stop at landmark #7 (Café DuMonde) to get more powdered sugar on your clothes. Landmark #8 (Jackson Square) is across the street.

When you get to Canal Street, turn right. Go four blocks and turn right onto

Bourbon Street. You can turn right at the next block and say you have driven on Bourbon Street or continue on as long as you dare. Slowly proceed down Bourbon Street and avert your eyes should a ladies legs pop out of a window. No landmarks here, but lots to look at.

When you decide to turn right, go one block and turn right again on Royal Street. Continue down Royal Street careful not to hit any pedestrians.

When you get to Canal Street again, keep going straight. You will magically be on St. Charles Avenue for the next part of the rally.

Continue down St. Charles until you get to First Street and turn left. This is a ways so you could stop at one of the many restaurants along the way. First street is shortly after the House of Brou wedding planner and of course the street sign is missing. It is a one way and fortunately you can make a u-turn on Third Street. Careful not hit or be hit by any street cars. Notice landmark #9 (oldest structure in New Orleans - 1838 Toby Westfield house). Go to 1420 First Street but look out for flying footballs. At 1239 First street notice the roses in the iron work on the second floor hence the Rose Gate. Do not pass this at night or you may be visited by a handsome sharped tooth man. 1134 First Street (Jacob Payne house where Jefferson Davis spent his last days 1889).

When you get to Magazine Street turn right. Go one block then turn right Second Street. Continue up to Prytania and make left. At 2514 Prytania (Opera house) cover your ears in case there is some high pitched singing going on. Go one block and make a left on Third Street. 1415 Third Street is Walter Robinson home (largest mansion in city and first indoor plumbing). Third and Coliseum is Michael Musson (uncle of Edgar Dega).

When you get to Magazine Street again turn right. Go one block and turn right on Fourth Street. Corner of Fourth and Coliseum is Sandra Bullock's home. Other corner is Colonel Short's Villa with cornstalk fence (each floor has over 5,000 square feet). When you get to Prytania, turn left. Go one block and turn left on Washington. Continue down Washington unless you want to stop at Commanders Palace and forget about the rest of the rally. Ask your driver "Why is there a fence around the Lafayette Cemetery?" If he / she does not know, the answer will be given at the end of the event.

Continue down to Magazine Street. Take a right and follow Magazine until you get tired of it. Then turn right on a convenient street and go back to St. Charles. Turn left and follow St Charles until it takes a right turn and becomes Carrollton Avenue. You will see landmark #10 (Camellia Grill).

Follow Carrollton until you go under I-10 and then turn left on Canal Boulevard. Follow Canal until you get to Lakeshore Drive. Fantasize living in one of the houses along Canal. Take a short drive along the lake and turn right (first right through the flood gate) when you get to Marconi Avenue. If the lake looks pretty inviting, just continue on alone Lakeshore Drive and double back when you have had enough.

Follow Marconi / Orleans Avenue (again fantasize living in some of these homes) until you get to City Park Avenue and then take the jog in the road but stay on Orleans Avenue. Follow Orleans until you go over a canal. One block after the canal is Hagan Avenue and you turn right there. Go two blocks to the Parkway Bakery and Tavern and find a spot to park.
