



So enough, already.....Name the car.....It's most likely 57 to 60 engine.....and it's progress 1960 till today.


Yup, I do find condensing a 50-60 year memory difficult.

New Buying/Selling Tools by Rick Huber



I thought I'd share a technique for helping to determine the value before purchasing or selling our Little British Cars. I first heard about it from Keith Anderson from the Mississippi club, a technique where he and the seller collected as much

information as they could find to judge together the value of the car for it's condition so that the selling price ended up being fair for both the buyer and the seller.

That technique of course is using the internet. It's pretty easy to find cars for sale, a little harder to try to judge the condition of cars for sale, and even harder to find actual sales where you can judge the condition. I found a great place that works very well. It's something Keith Martin's Sports Car Market magazine has put together along with American Car Collector and eBay. The

site is CollectorCarPriceTracker.com, where you can enter the particular car you're buying or selling, and it will search the internet for recent sales and calculate an average price for three conditions. For recent eBay sales, it will give you a link to a saved page where you can read the description of the car to assess it's condition. As an example, I put in 1965 to 1967 MG B with Overdrive, those cars being the 5 main bearing engine cars with a steel dash. The search found 37 sales since 2005, with 7 in the last year, and 2 in the last 90 days, lists Fair/Good/Excellent condition average prices, and includes a link to all 37 of the sales with the condition information about the car. For this search, the average values were Fair: \$10,650 Good: \$15,250 and Excellent: \$18,750.

Armed with that kind of information, it should be easier to agree on a selling price that is fair to both the buyer and the seller. It worked for me! Happy hunting.

More on Tools

PHONE: Tool for calling your local parts dealer to see if he has any neat new tools.

SNAP-ON GASKET SCRAPER: Theoretically useful as a sandwich tool for spreading mayonnaise; used mainly for getting dog-doo off your shoe.

E-Z OUT BOLT AND STUD EXTRACTOR: A tool that snaps off in bolt holes and is ten times harder than any known drill bit.

TIMING LIGHT: A stroboscopic instrument for illuminating grease buildup.

TWO-TON HYDRAULIC ENGINE HOIST: A handy tool for testing the tensile strength of ground straps and brake lines you have forgotten to disconnect.

CRAFTSMAN $1/2 \ge 16$ -INCH SCREWDRIVER: A large prying tool that inexplicably has an accurately machined screwdriver tip on the end without the handle.

BATTERY ELECTROLYTE TESTER: A handy tool for transferring sulfuric acid from a car battery to the inside of your toolbox after determining that your battery is dead as a doornail, just as you thought.

AVIATION METAL SNIPS: See hacksaw.

PHILLIPS SCREWDRIVER: Normally used to stab the lids of old-style paper-and-tin oil cans and splash oil on your shirt; can also be used, as the name implies, to round off Phillips screw heads.



24th Annual British Car Day by Don Marpe



Saturday March 22, 2014 is now less than three months from now and preparation for the car show is in full swing. The contract with Delgado College has been signed and the money paid. Steve Lindsley and team have finishing

up the final touches on this year's shirt design and it will go to the shirt vendor soon. 




