


2014 Special Award Winners



Selected by Peter Brauen of BMC Restorations. This car is all original, still in good condition but it has been DRIVEN. It represents an excellent combination of "patina" and mileage Sponsored by BMC Restorations





The Arnolt-MG was developed and sold by Stanley H. "Wacky" Arnolt, an early importer of European cars to the United States in the early 1950's. S.H. Arnolt, Inc., one of this country's first distributors of British cars, distributed marques such as Riley, MG, Morris Minor, Aston-Martin, Rolls-Royce and Austin-Healey, and was registered as a Licensed Automotive Manufacturer in the State of Illinois. The Arnolt-MG, designed by Giovanni and Nuccio Bertone and Giovanni Michelotti was built in Italy by Bertone with some final assembly in the U.S. It featured an MG TD chassis, XPAG engine and drivetrain with a steel and aluminum 4 seat coupe body. This British/Italian/American "hybrid" is one of only a few automobiles which legitimately wears badges from the three different auto companies: MG, Bertone, and Arnolt. Arnolt subsequently built cars based on Bristol, Aston-Martin and Bentley mechanicals.

All Arnolt cars are quite rare, but this particular car is especially unique since it is a completely original example and was owned by the Arnolt family until December 2010 when it was purchased as part of an estate sale. The car has fewer than 2,400 documented total miles, and is completely original (paint, bodywork, interior, chassis and drivetrain) except for minor mechanical work to keep the car running. The car was imported into the U.S. in January 1954 by S.H. Arnolt, Inc.(S.H. Arnolt, President) and transferred to Hoosier International Motors (S.H. Arnolt, President) on an importers license plate, in this case, #4. It was first titled in 1969 to Hoosier International Corporation (S.H. Arnolt, III President) and subsequently transferred to S.H. Arnolt, III in July 1993. It remained in the Arnolt family until it was sold as part of the estate sale in December 2010. The last registered title is still in the name of Stanley H. Arnolt, III.

I purchased this time-warp car through an auction in February of 2013 and plan to keep the car as completely original as possible, right down to the set of bias ply General Tires she currently wears. The Arnolt has been features in a number of magazine articles including the 1953 Sports Car Album, the June-July issue of British Car Magazine and most recently, this specific car was featured in the May 2012 issue of Classic Motorsports Magazine.

I plan to show the car in the Preservation Class at various Concours d'Elegance and at local British and Italian car shows. I also look forward to the occasional pleasant Sunday morning drive.


