

Chef's Corner.....by Karen Murray, Vice President BMCNO



This recipe was introduced at the Progression Dinner and has become very popular at board meetings. Just in time for the holidays. I always double the recipe because it does go fast. I hope that you enjoy as much as my guests and family.



Baked Loaded Cauliflower

Ingredients:

1 large head of Cauliflower cut into bite size pieces (approximately 6 cups)

6-8 strips of bacon cooked and crumbled (Cooked in oven at 400 for 20 minutes)

6 tablespoons chopped chives

1/2 cup mayo

1/2 cup sour cream

2 cups Colby Jack Cheese (may use cheddar)

8-oz. container sliced mushrooms

Preheat oven to 425 degrees

In a large pot boil water cook cauliflower 8-10 minutes

In a large bowl combine sour cream, mayo, 1/2 of the crumbles bacon, 3 tablespoons chives, 1 cup of cheese, mushrooms and cauliflower and mix well.

Place in a baking dish and sprinkle over the remaining 1 cup of cheese and the remaining bacon crumbles.

Bake for 15-20 minutes until all cheese is melted.

Top with remaining chives. *ENJOY*!!!!




