The January Member meeting was preceded by the distribution of King Cake. British Cookies were also distributed, being provided by Linda Hughes. The Meeting was called to order at 7:13 p.m. by Club President

All additional parts will be covered by donations, Labor also was volunteer. No bill will be presented even though the Sargent expects to pay for the work to the wind-shield and top.

Floyd Friloux discussed a Jaguar meeting held at his business, with 30 Jaguar club members attending. Steve L. discussed his artwork placement in Moss Motors magazine. New Member Edmond Vail discussed his 1968 MGB-GT, with Ed being the original owner. It has crossed the ocean 3 times.

The 50/50 raffle for \$25 was won by Jim Hoppe, who promptly donated it back to the club. Allen Bradley won a flashlight, Don Marpe won a circuit tester. John McCarron won a sponge, Peter Weber won Microfiber Cloths, and finally, Darek Guichard won a squeegee.

Please bring dishes before 5:30 p.m. Doors open for serving at 6:00 p.m.



Preservation Award sponsored by Peter Brauen



Un-restored cars may not be the headline-making winners of best-in-show awards, but preservation classes are increasingly a feature of many events, and collectors are recognizing their special status by driving up their

prices. "Barn find," a catchall term for cars unearthed after decades of neglect, has become a buzzword on cable television and at auctions of vintage autos.

For those exceedingly uncommon examples of vintage cars that have managed to survive with original powertrains, finishes and interiors in sufficient condition to serve as an exemplar for a correct restoration on other less fortunate examples, clearly, careful preservation is the route that will ultimately result in the greatest return on their owners' investments

To be Certified as a SURVIVOR in our show the car must met this set of standards:

- 1. Is 25 years or older
- 2. Drivable
- 3. Is over 50% un-restored, un-refinished, and unaltered from the way it left the factory in at least three of the four areas
 - Exterior (Paint, Trim, Glass)
 - Interior / Trunk
 - Under Hood d. Chassis (Suspension, Frame, Wheels)

4. Over 50% of the original finishes (paint, fab-

rics, plating) remain good color references for the restoration of a car just like it.

PRESERVATION CLASS CONDITION CARS should have virtually all of their original factory paint intact and in good condition. A small unobtrusive blend on a panel or two or minor touchups are acceptable but at least 80% of the exterior finish should be original factory applied paint. The paint should be in sufficient condition to accurately convey the original shade and be reflective. Minor scratches, checking, and small dings are expected and acceptable.

With the exception of consumables such as rubber floor mats, the interior of the car should also be original. Soft materials such as leather may display a patina, dirt, minor discoloration and minor cracking but no tears. Replaced material should be at a minimum and be unobtrusive.

The engine compartment and trunk should also be well preserved and original with no paintwork and with original wiring harnesses intact and functional. It is expected that consumables such as hoses and belts may have been replaced; however, the car must have the powertrain that it was delivered with, its original tools (if supplied), and a period spare should be present.





The Barataria Preserve outside Marrero offers a taste of Louisiana's wild wetlands. The preserve's 23,000 acres include bayous, swamps, marshes, forests, alligators, nutrias, and over 200 species of birds. Boardwalk and dirt trails wind through the preserve; check out the trail map, enjoy a self-guided tour, or explore with a cell phone tour. Exhibits at the preserve visitor center highlight how the Mississippi River built Louisiana's wetlands, the national importance of the area, and the relation between the land and its people. Kids can earn a badge with the Junior Ranger program.

Jean Lafitte Museum

The 6,000-square-foot, Barataria Museum tells the 200-year-old story of the Town of Jean Lafitte, a historic fishing village 20 miles southwest of New Orleans. Featuring a multi-media theatre presentation, an animated museum exhibition and a nature study trail, the museum leads visitors on a journey through the life of pirate Jean Lafitte, the stories and folk traditions of wetland dwellers and the realities of coastal erosion and natural and man-made disasters.
