Baton Rouge Cruise 2016 by Rick Huber



Wow, what a day for a British car drive through the Feliciana countryside! The good Lord cooperated with marvelous weather, and 48 of us took advantage for a lovely outing to Jackson and St. Francisville. I don't know how much it stirred the competitive nature of

the participants, but I wonder if the challenge to eclipse the gathering in the 2011 picture added a few folks that might have been on the fence. Rick and Milton calling all the club's MGA owners didn't hurt either, and neither did the membership pizza night that got a bunch of BR folks out on Wednesday

This event has been weakly attended the last couple of years, so what a delight to see so many people and so many British cars (16) gathering together at CC's Coffee. We had 4 MGAs, a few MGBs, a few TR6s, a TR4, an MG Magnette (I think), an E-Type Jag, a big Healey replica, and a modern Aston Martin, a couple of Mini's and a few Jaguars. Notable non-British cars were a Miata and a friend driving Milton's 64 Buick Riviera with gas, water, tools bringing up the rear to help anybody who might need it. Grace and good fortune were with us, nobody needed the help.





Rick only made 10 copies of the driving directions thinking the cold would keep people away, but there are many hearty ones among us - particularly those couples who braved the elements without side curtains on their MGAs. My hat's off to you. We were plenty comfortable in the E-Type, despite no heater. The temperature never got above 48 despite brilliant blue skies and



bright sunshine. Did I mention, what a day for a country drive!

After missing a turn (yes, it was on the printed directions and Mary Lynne pointed it out - funny how at 61 I'm still trusting my memory!) and leading 20 or so cars through a 3 point turn on a two lane country road, things were pretty relaxed, and anything but routine with our little British cars, some dating all the way back to the 50's out showing their stuff

Our first stop was the Feliciana Cellers Winery in Jackson. We parked the 4 MGAs in front of the "Parthenon" outside for pictures, and then

herded all 48 of us for a couple of pictures. From there it was in to the winery to mouse around the gift shop, get a tour of the production facilities, and then participate in a tasting. The muscadine vinyard is just a couple of miles away, and the winery distributes all around the



state. Many among us were pleased with the tasting and brought a bottle or two home with us. This is the same spot where 30 of us visited in 2011, but I didn't hear any complaints from those who had been before



From there it was on to the BR Model Railroaders train exhibit at the back of the Jackson History Museum.

First it was up the treacherous wet gravel hill to get out of the winery.

Reg had some trouble spinning the wheels and digging holes on one side of the driveway, but he deftly kept moving back and forth, side to side, and finally found a spot that was solid enough to climb the hill. All the rest of us avoided that spot Reg so generously scouted out for us.

The museum was very nice, a highlight for us car affectionados was a collection of Model Ts and As and some WWII vehicles. Jackson hosted



a very large WWII training facility and I guess got to keep some of the things the military left behind

The trains were amazing - the model railroaders meet there every 2nd and 4th Saturday from 11 to 3 and open to the public. It looks like all gauges (sizes) are represented with 4 large indoor panoramas with intricately detailed countryside, rural town, and city landscapes. A highlight was a model Mt. Rushmore with a drive in theater right next door, and believe it or not, on the 4" screen, Alfred Hitchcock's "North by Northwest" was showing on the outdoor screen. If you looked really closely, you could see a British Leyland flag in one of the small town

scenes, Ronnie got a picture for those who missed it.

In addition to the 4 indoor panoramas, there was an outdoor train scene with a board describing



10 things to find, including a man eating turtle.

The last set up was a covered, outdoor set of tracks where a few of the railroaders were running two steam powered trains - run on butane but had a fully functioning steam boiler and propulsion system. Fascinating!



All good things must come to an end, and despite some chili and king cake provided by the hosts, many stomachs were growling by 1:15, so we gathered in front of the museum to set off for another 20 mile drive through the winding, hilly countryside on Hwy 421 back to Hwy 61 and then down to St. Francisville for a late lunch at the world famous Magnolia Cafe.

The crowd dwindled some for lunch, partly because it was later than we usually eat and some people had other things scheduled, but as usual, it was worth the wait. We sat in tables of 6 or fewer, and the staff had no trouble getting our orders and our food very quickly. There had been time for meeting and greeting at the first three venues, but a sit down lunch gave new and old club members from all over the southern part of the state a chance to get to know each other. Bobby said if you ever have the opportunity to sit with club legends Bill Avery and Dick Prestridge (Bob Gullic too, but he couldn't make it

In Memory of Wayne Pangburn



Wayne Pangburn, a friend and longtime BMCNO member has passed away. Our hearts and prayers go out to Wayne's family. Please view the obituary below.

Wayne Alan Pangburn, 71, passed away peacefully in his sleep at home on Monday, December 14, 2015.

He was born in Newark, N.J., graduated from Stoneham High in Stoneham, Mass., and went on to earn a BA degree in economics from Bates College in Lewiston, Me. While at Bates, Wayne was the 1965 and 1966 NCAA College Division National Champion in the hammer throw. His distance record at Bates was not surpassed until 1999.

Following college, he served three years as an officer in the United States Army. Wayne married his junior high sweetheart, Stacia Roberts, on October 22, 1967. Wayne continued his athletic career as a member of the Army Track Team and was the hammer throw alternate for Team USA for the 1968 Olympics. In 1969, Wayne began a successful career in Boston in the life insurance industry. He ultimately rose to the position of Vice-President of Marketing for New England Life. In 1982, he began a private benefits consulting practice in his wife's hometown, New Roads, La.

Wayne co-founded The Pangburn Group with his son to provide recordkeeping services for retirement plans in 1996. Under Wayne's leadership, the fledgling company grew to be nationally recognized and employ over 50 people in his community. He was actively employed until the time of his death.

Wayne was an avid fisherman and car enthusiast, but he will be remembered by most for his strength, wit, quiet leadership, and generosity. He was a loving and dedicated husband, father, and grandfather. He leaves behind his wife of 48 years, Stacia, son Brian, daughter Christie, daughter-in-law Jaimee, and four grandchildren, Jack, Jeremiah, Archer, and Malik. He was preceded in death by his parents, Sheldon Edward Pangburn and Myrtle Brown McIlravey.

Memorial/Visitation was at Niland's Funeral Home in New Roads, La, on Friday, December 18th.
