

2016 British Car Day is just 3 weeks away



Time has been flying by and fortunately there has been lots of preparation for the car show done in that time. All of the needed chairman for the events have

stepped up and are making the prep for their part of the car show. The show shirts have been designed, ordered, and are now ready for sale. The awards have been ordered and will be picked up in the next couple of weeks. The invitations to all of the past show attendees have been sent and many of those people have already registered. The reminder letter to all of the club members has been sent and many of the club members had already registered before the letters went out. In the next three weeks, any club members that have not registered will get a phone call making sure they know about the show and encourage them to bring their car so everyone can see them.

There are a few things that we will be doing different this year to make the show even better and easier to get ready for. The Goodie Bag stuffing party will be at Delgado College in the automotive school buildings. This makes the transporting of the pickup load of goodie bags to the show area much easier. The Goodie Bag stuffing will be done on Saturday March 12 starting at 9:00 and should finish in time to go to lunch at a nearby restaurant. Of course there will be coffee and doughnuts to tide us over until



lunch. The assembly of the registration packets may take place at a location more convenient to the registration chairman Cathy Greensfelder. She will set up the time and place that works for her. This will eliminate having to move all of her computer stuff and office supplies around.

The field layout of the cars for the show will also look a little different. We are going to showcase the cars that started the whole British Invasion by putting their areas up at the front of the field. The poor Jag owners will have to go way to the back of the grassy area. That means the MG Ts, TD, etc. will be where the Jags were previously. The MGAs will be next to the sidewalk and the vintages will work their way back from there. Team and the Parking and Traffic Team to set up the final layout. It will be easy for everyone to find the area for their cars because Tom McMillan is making new Class Signs for the field. They will be A-frame signs that work on the grass (or asphalt but that will not be needed) with the car / class info on both sides. The class letters will be big, the marque and model info will be in smaller letters and the shirt logo will be on the bottom. This will class up the field a lot.

You can expect the staging of the cars on show day to go better also. Ed Vail is providing Walkie Talkies for the Parking and Traffic Team so they will be able to assist cars getting in the right spot quicker and with less arm waving and



running.

2016 Preservation Award sponsored by Peter Brauen



Un-restored cars may not be the headline-making winners of best-inshow awards, but preservation classes are increasingly a feature of many events, and collectors are recognizing their special status by driving up their

prices. "Barn find," a catchall term for cars unearthed after decades of neglect, has become a buzzword on cable television and at auctions of vintage autos.

For those exceedingly uncommon examples of vintage cars that have managed to survive with original powertrains, finishes and interiors in sufficient condition to serve as an exemplar for a correct restoration on other less fortunate examples, clearly, careful preservation is the route that will ultimately result in the greatest return on their owners' investments

To be Certified as a SURVIVOR in our show the car must met this set of standards:

- 1. Is 25 years or older
- 2. Drivable
- 3. Is over 50% un-restored, un-refinished, and unaltered from the way it left the factory in at least three of the four areas
 - Exterior (Paint, Trim, Glass)
 - Interior / Trunk
 - Under Hood d. Chassis (Suspension, Frame, Wheels)
 - Over 50% of the original finishes

(paint, fabrics, plating) remain good color references for the restoration of a car just like it.

PRESERVATION CLASS CONDITION CARS should have virtually all of their original factory paint intact and in good condition. A small unobtrusive blend on a panel or two or minor touchups are acceptable but at least 80% of the exterior finish should be original factory applied paint. The paint should be in sufficient condition to accurately convey the original shade and be reflective. Minor scratches, checking, and small dings are expected and acceptable.

With the exception of consumables such as rubber floor mats, the interior of the car should also be original. Soft materials such as leather may display a patina, dirt, minor discoloration and minor cracking but no tears. Replaced material should be at a minimum and be unobtrusive.

The engine compartment and trunk should also be well preserved and original with no paintwork and with original wiring harnesses intact and functional. It is expected that consumables such as hoses and belts may have been replaced; however, the car must have the powertrain that it was delivered with, its original tools (if supplied), and a period spare should be present.




