May 21, 2016 Event - Keesler Air Force Base tour by Karen Murray

When most people hear the words "Tropical Storm" or "Hurricane," their first thought is to head for cover. However, for a small group of people, it's time to head to work. These are the crews that fly and man the aircraft of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) better known as the Hurricane Hunters.

NOAA operates two Lockheed WP-3D Orions (N42RF "Kermit" and N43RF "Miss Piggy) and one Gulfstream G IV (N49RF "Gonzo") as Hurricane Hunters out of MacDill Air Force Base in Tampa, Fla. Additional support is supplied by Lockheed WC130-J aircraft of the 53rd Weather



Reconnaissance Squadron of the Air Force Reserve based at Kessler Air Force Base in Biloxi, Miss.

The different aircraft in the Hurricane Hunter fleet serve unique roles. The P-3s are flown at low altitudes directly into the storms to gather wind speed and direction, temperature and pressure data. In addition to instruments on the aircraft themselves, the numbers are obtained by dropping <u>dropsondes</u> through the bottom of the aircraft that transmit the data to gathering equipment on the aircraft. The Gulfstream G- IV flies at high altitude to gather data regarding winds and conditions above and around the storm, also by using dropsondes.

You are now wondering "what does this have to do with my British car"?

One of our members, Jeff Ragusa, is a hurricane hunter and I followed his travels with the plane when it was touring the Caribbean. Landing at every island they also gave tours of the plane. So...what a great opportunity for BMCNO to take a private tour of this interesting and life saving piece of machinery.

In one of the many conservations Jeff also gave me a history lesson on the fact that after WWII the United States had so many air strips some of them were used for car racing.



Check out the next page for a tentative schedule of our day. NOTE: we all arrive together for security reasons. It is a very ambitious schedule that I hope we can keep.

We will have time to drive our British "ONLY" cars on the air strip and then we will run again with a Kessler Air Force Personnel. The schedule has been confirmed for Saturday, May 21st. Attached is the information that I must have to Jeff by May 10th. Everyone in your car will have to be included on this form and everyone in your car will need a photo identification without exception. Also, let's all try to wear a BMCNO shirt to recognize our group.

Maxwell Benson —1939 - 2016



Max was born in Ambleside. Cumbria in the Lake District of England in December, 1939. His parents lived in Liverpool but wanted him to be born in the Lake District where his father originated, so off they went for him to be born there. Max grew

up in Childwall, a leafy suburb on the outskirts of Liverpool, during the era of the Beatles and Fleetwood Mac (same neighborhood) and since Liverpool is a port city (very similar in many ways to New Orleans) he decided to go to sea.

At sixteen Max enrolled as Cadet Marine Engineer, this consisted of a five year period in which Max would spend equal periods of academia in a technical engineering college and hands-on experience on different vessels in the Brocklebank fleet.

On completion of this Cadetship, Max was assigned to different vessels in the Brocklebank and subsequently Cunard Brocklebank fleet and progressed up to the position of Third Engineer on the cargo vessels. His many duties would include maintenance of the steam main engine and ancillary equipment that would include the generators for the vessels electrical systems. During this period he became an Acting Second Engineer and was involved in helping to avert a serious fire on board a vessel in Dundee, with a cargo of Jute.

After a period of some years, Max left Cunard Brocklebank and joined a vessel being built in Newcastle, in North East England for an American Companies United Kingdom subsidiary Maritime Overseas, now known as OSG Group. This vessel was the start of the huge oil tankers called VLCC (Very Large Crude Carrier) that had the capacity to carry some 300,000 tons of crude oil. This type of vessel later proved very fortuitous with the closing of the Suez Canal, as they were able to carry these large amounts of oil from the Persian Gulf to Europe travelling round the Cape, the southern tip of South Africa.

Max did leave this company after four or five years and re-joined Cunard Brocklebank as a Refrigeration Engineer. This position became vacant due to Cunard purchasing three fleets of refrigeration vessels from the former Island Fruit Company. These vessels carried fresh produce/fish frozen or chilled and due to their cargo were by virtue of the cargos they carried, capable of high speed passages. This made them very suitable to carry fresh stores and spares to the Falklands during the Falkland's conflict.

He then transferred to the container fleet of ACT (Associated Container Transportation), managed by Cunard Shipping Services. They traded between Australia/New Zealand and UK/Europe. During this time Max had a serious accident falling down an access ladder to the hatch refrigeration control equipment, breaking both legs and ankles and doctors said he would never walk again, his sea days were over.

On one of his early trips to sea he came to New Orleans...where he met his now wife Carol when they were both teenagers, she was a Girl Scout working on a mariner scout badge on his ship via her connections to the Daughters of the British Empire who were hosting the officers on the English ships in port. They eventually went their separate ways and met up again many years later at a family gathering. He worked in various capacities as a mechanical engineer in Liverpool until he retired in 2006. In the meantime Carol was transferred by IBM to the UK, they married in 2011 and moved to the Northshore in 2013 to be closer to her parents. The move included a 20 foot container of household goods, three pets and a 1971 MGB. The 1998 MGF couldn't make the journey due to US import restrictions on this type of car.

Max was a founding member of the Merseyside MG Owners Club and enjoyed being the route designer for the annual charity runs through the English countryside, sponsored by the club. Max and Carol took the MGB and the MGF on many trips abroad...camping several times at the leMans 24 hour Classic Run (with two weeks of camping gear and clothes/food packed into every inch of the car along with a hair dryer with special outlet installed in the glove box), the Gordon Bennett Run near Dublin, Ireland a few times, a lovely run with 45 MGs from all over the UK to the Scottish Highlands. During the summers an MG Owners Club chapter would host a run almost every weekend, ending up at a stately home for a picnic or a country pub for a lovely meal. He also went on many trips with Paul Georgeson (UK BMCNO member) to MG Live at Silverstone and they even completed the London to Brighton Regency Run with almost a thousand other MGs. Those little cars and the driver have seen lots of action! Quite often the MGB would be in bits in the driveway, then after a few hours amazingly all back together again, no bits left over and immediately on the road again.

This picture was taken during a December Christmas Cracker Run in the Lake District, up and down steep hills and dales, narrow switchback roads and really cold and wet weather, what fun! His introduction to BMCNO was at a party hosted by the Daughters of the British Empire where he met Wally and Margaret Friloux. That club has a lot to answer for...

He loved jazz, was a frustrated drummer and was more than happy to enjoy the wonderful New Orleans jazz scene. Finding the Dew Drop Inn so close to home was amazing to him and had many fun evenings there.

He never met a stranger, would talk your arm off and was a real 'people person'.

Sadly Max was quite poorly for the last eighteen months and didn't get to fully enjoy the good life in South Louisiana. There will be a memorial service held in Liverpool in April and he will be joined again with his family in the Lake District.
