When many people think of Louisiana, they think of the French settlements. Tim Lantrip has long been aware of the Northshore's English ancestry, and he was raised drinking traditional English tea with his grandmother. Inspired by that personal history, Tim and his wife opened the English Tea Room.

The Union Jack flies from the porch of the bungalowstyle cottage in downtown Covington, and a vintage red phone booth takes residence outside as naturally as it would on the streets of London. Inside the English Tea Room, a collection of vintage and new china is perched on open shelves and in cupboards—teacups and saucers, beautiful pots, and silver spoons, though none breathe a stuffy air of formality while standing among cardboard cutouts of Downton Abbey characters and Alice in Wonderland murals. The carefree whimsy of the tradition is not lost on Tim, as he is an aficionado of the tea ritual performed in the United Kingdom in palatial to perfectly pedestrian settings for ages.

"We don't do fast food here," says Tim. He believes in the pause in the day provided by the tea tradition, and he's acquired quite a company of tea-drinkers and scone-nibblers who would agree with his ideology of slow living. Check out their website englishtearoom.com for menu and tea items.

## Belissima! The Italian Automotive Renaissance, 1945-1975 by Rick Huber

While in Nashville visiting our new grandson in early July, our daughter Allison said there was a great car exhibit at the Frist Center. We had a couple hour break on Sunday afternoon, so we went to see it. Wow, it was something else, an exhibit celebrating Italian automotive design following WWII. The designers came back to the automotive industry after designing airplanes, and incorporated many of those concepts into cars. Ferrari, Lamborghini, Maserati, Alfa Romeo, and more. There were 22 vehicles displayed, the most breathtaking of which (for us car people anyway), were the three Alfa Romeo BAT prototypes 5, 7, and 9 (picture). Another one of those 39 Ferrari's is the current highest auction sale in the world, at \$38 million. There we were right up next to these fabulous cars. The

collection was delightful and even included Italian design influence into American cars. For a look at all of the exhibit cars and more information on the display, use this <u>Frist Center</u> link. For an in-person view, the display will be there until October 9.

# British Motoring Club New Orleans—Board of Directors

- (a) Authority: All of the corporate powers of this corporation and the management of its affairs shall be vested in and controlled by the Board of Directors.
- (b) Election and Term: Directors shall be elected annually by the members at a General Meeting of the club in the last quarter of each calendar year. Nominations for officers must be received by the Secretary four weeks prior to the General Meeting at which the election is to be held. Such directors shall assume office at the January officers' meeting and shall hold office for one year, with the limitation of three (3) consecutive terms in any one position. The exception to the term limitation being that of the office of Editor. In the event a director's position becomes vacant, the Board of Directors shall appoint a replacement officer until the next General meeting at which the club shall elect a replacement director.
- (c) Number of Directors: The Board of Directors shall consist of five members, who shall also serve as the President, Vice-President, Newsletter Editor, Secretary, and Treasurer of the Club. Additional directors (herein referred to as members-at-large) shall be elected for every thirty (30) members in good standing. When the average number of members exceeds thirty per each member-at-large, another member-at-large shall be added to the Board of Directors at the next scheduled election of Directors.

### (d) Duties

President: The President shall preside at all meetings of the members and officers and shall perform the duties usually pertaining to this office. The President will serve as the Chief Executive Officer of the Club and as Chairman of the Board of Directors. Special meetings may be called only by the President's authority.

Vice President: It shall be the duty of the Vice President to act as Activities Director and Chairman of all Club Committees. In the absence of the President, the Vice President shall preside at meetings of the members and officers.

Treasurer: The Treasurer shall, subject to such conditions and restrictions as may be made by the officers, have custody of all monies, debts, and obligations belonging to the Club. All money of the Club shall be received and deposited into the Club account by the Treasurer. All debts of the Club shall be paid by the Treasurer. Any contracts, checking drafts, notes, or other orders for payment of money shall be cosigned in the name of the Club by the President and the Treasurer. The Treasurer shall be prepared to report on the financial status of the Club at every meeting.

Secretary: The secretary shall keep records of all minutes and notes. The Secretary shall keep an updated roll of all Club members. The Secretary shall prepare the ballot for election of officers and process absentee ballots.

Newsletter Editor: The Newsletter Editor shall publish a club newsletter as set forth elsewhere in these by-laws.

Members-at-Large: It shall be the duty of the Members-at-Large to represent the general club membership at all meetings. Members-at-Large may be assigned certain duties by a majority of the officers.

(e) No obligations, debts, or other liability shall be incurred on behalf of the Club by any board member without the specific prior approval of a majority of the directors.



### Proposed By Law Amendment by Karen Murray, Vice President BMCNO



SECOND POST-ING. I would like to propose an amendment to our current By Laws. The bylaws currently read as follows:

(b) Election and Term: Directors shall be elected

Board of Directors shall appoint a replacement officer until the next General meeting at which the club shall elect a replacement director.

My amendment would add our Webmaster as a Board Member with exception to term limitation as the Newsletter Editor. It would read as follows:

b) Election and Term: Directors shall be elected annually by the members at a General Meeting of the club in the last guarter of each calendar year. Nominations for officers must be received by the Secretary four weeks prior to the General Meeting at which the election is to be held. Such directors shall assume office at the January officers' meeting and shall hold office for one year, with the limitation of three (3) consecutive terms in any one position. The exception to the term limitation being that of the office of Editor and Webmaster. In the event a director's position becomes vacant, the Board of Directors shall appoint a replacement officer until the next General meeting at which the club shall elect a replacement director.




