Wally had to round up drivers and give everyone instructions individually with the 3 minutes between each car's departure. The first car was out at 9:10. Once each car was off, it was a merry time driving around the back roads north of Covington and Abita Springs, trying to follow the directions, locate all the checkpoints, answer all the questions from signs along the way, follow the speed limits including the warning signs, and make all the correct turns to stay on the rally path and try to keep the time close to the recorded but unknown time. All went pretty well until about 2/3 of the way through, one turn with a typo saying turn left when it was intended to be right. 


## Racing with Robbie by Robbie Robertson



The first SCCA Road Race I saw was at the "The Big D" Daytona International Raceway. It was the 1969 Runoffs. I said right then and there, "I want to do that!" Next to our car was this red GT with very little signage. I asked the Japanese man driving it what it was, "Datsun 240Z, new car coming out soon!"

The first time I drove the banks of Daytona was August 22, 1976. Marian accompanied me along with the unofficial Spridget Race Team; two G Production Sprites, an H production "Bugeye" Sprite and my F Production AH Sprite. Marian set me up, as she asked me, "How did you like it?" I said, "Wow, it was great, I could do it all day long!" Everyone around my car started to laugh. I asked, "What is going on?" They said, "Marian said you would say that!"

I had a 4.22 rear gear in the car so I could not go as fast down the back straight as a car with a 3.9 rear gear out of a Morris Minor.

As a side note, in the seventies there was no "Bus Stop Chicane" at the end of the back straight. We would go into the East Bank at full speed. This all changed when Peter Graves had a right front shock tower failure on his 911 Porsche going into the East Bank. The stock cars have built up right front suspensions, but they do not have to turn right in their races. The only things we got out of the car were Peter and the roll cage. To slow sports cars down, Daytona installed the chicane. I was the Gold Coast PCA photographer at the time.



On Saturdays race I realized that I was graded second, so the fastest 4.22 rear gear Sprites and Midgets. The first place Sprite had a 3.9 rear gear so I could not beat him. I strategized how to beat the other 4.22 F-Production Spridgets. As we drove the Pace Lap, I realized that I would be behind a TR4 in E-Production. I stayed on his bumper holding off a white and red striped MG Midget. When we hit the back straight, I drafted the TR4, and the white and red Midget shrank in my rear-view mirror. After a few laps, the TR4 slowed down, so I passed him. As the race was ending, a TR3 blew its engine going into the East Bank. The rod cap bounced off

the track surface and was headed for my head, so I moved up the track, missing the cap by twelve inches. A friend of mine handed out the trophies and told the audience that I had driven a very smart race to wind up second. From the tower he had seen my drafting of the TR4.

The next day, Sunday, I lost my engine. Number 3 rod came through the side of the block. It seems that the Woodruff Key had ridden up on the crank shaft, causing the harmonic balancer to crack so that when I came down off the Tri Oval into the infield, the crack acted like a scoop, and as the oil surged forward it would be scooped out the front of the engine. Eventually, there was no oil and the number three bearing spun and the rod came through the side of the engine. I had not noticed the smoke as I was braking and setting up the first turn into the infield.

I drove "The Big D" again in August of 1977 with a 3.9 rear-end gear. I was living in Tallahassee by then and had a new machine shop. They had put seals on the intake valves so the intakes would seize up. The Spridgets Race Team helped me with the head, and I was ready for Sunday. It rained, so my dry tires were not up to the challenge, and I wound up sixth.

I never ran Daytona again as I concentrated on winning the 1979 F-Production Florida Region Championship. After that I raced into 1980, but had to stop because of my family growing, and the money I made rebuilding British Sports Cars went to the cost of raising a family and not racing.

My son Robert and I enjoyed going to the 24 Hours of Daytona for 20 years. The difference in the size of the crowd grew very much over the years, becoming exceedingly popular.

The Roar Before the Rolex 24 is on January 18-21, 2024, and the Rolex 24 at Daytona is January 24-28, 2024. You should attend. When I attend the 24, I have many memories of being on the track in my little Spridget.



#### Tech Tip:

Fasten tie raps around the spark plug wires so you know which wire goes to which. Very important with six cylinders, as I bought a TR-6 for \$1,000.00 that was not running right and all I did was reverse number 3 and 4 plug wires. I then sold the car for \$3,500.00.





## The Archival Vault by Lee H. Matthews

The 1967 MGB GT Special was a limited-edition car sold by the factory to USA retailers to commemorate the first anniversary of the MGB coupe. The brochure said that it was "The most important sale in MG History." A total of 1,000 cars were factory built. These were not a separate factory model but presented to dealers with a package of no-cost options including wire wheels, leather upholstery, racing mirrors, a wooden steering wheel and wooden gearshift knob.

In addition, the package had front fender badging just in front of the door, which indicated it was a special. The rectangle badge had an octagon shaped Union Jack and the lettering MGB/GT SPECIAL. Although later that year the package, MINUS the special fender badging could be ordered through a dealer to any stock MGB GT at an extra cost.
