I am wrenching and polishing the Alpine in preparation, and I look forward to seeing all of you there.







Broken – Down B Brakes by Chris Savoy

During our Springfield cruise in mid-January, Michele's MGB lost brake pedal. We managed to make it home safely with skilled downshifting and a keen eye on the e-brake lever. After parking the car at our temporary storage area, I quickly determined the master cylinder had failed. I prefer to rebuild rather than replace, so I ordered a seal kit. I thoroughly cleaned the unit, all of its internals, and honed the cylinder. I bench bled the master and attempted to re-install it on the car. That's where the job took a bad turn.



One of the flare fittings on the car had been crossthreaded. How it was not leaking I don't know. The threads were too damaged to re-use, and upon further inspection, I discovered the corresponding threads in the master were damaged as well. So much for good intentions. I ordered a replacement master and was able to fit it to the car with little trouble. I also replaced the entire line that had the bad flare nut. Luckily, that happened to be the driver's front line; the shortest line in the car.







After installing the new master cylinder and brake line, I drove the car to a location where I could raise all four corners for bleeding. This is where I ran into more issues. The brakes would not bleed out completely, and my attempt at replacing hydraulic clutch fluid was equally challenging. The clutch slave would absolutely not bleed.




Broken – Down B Brakes cont'd

A conversation with Keith Vezina, one of our skilled club mechanics, led me down the path to completion. Keith advised me to unscrew the nylon brake pressure switch (mounted under the master) 3-1/2 turns before attempting to bleed the system; and that the drums should be adjusted properly before beginning the procedure. I followed his advice, and purchased a vac-bleeder for the job. Our brake pedal returned with little fuss. Keith also advised that clutch slaves are coming from Moss with the bleeder screws in the wrong hole. We decided my clutch slave would need replacing, as well as the pushrod and clevis pin. The slave arrived with the bleeder screw in the wrong hole as predicted, and that was remedied. I bled the slave off the mounts with it hanging by the soft line, as advised by Keith.

Since I had the car off the ground, I took the opportunity to grease all under-chassis fittings and adjust the brakes. We drove to car 130 miles to Middendorf's and back without any issues!

This was a challenging job for me that was not as straightforward as other masters I have worked on. My advice is: check the threads before rebuilding, purchase a vac-bleeder, and check to make sure the clutch slave on your B is properly set up!








MORE BMCNO CARS AND COFFEE!!





Stay to the right by the Chevron station.



British Motoring Club of New Orleans Valve Cover Raceway

BMCNO Race Rules

- The Valve Cover Race Cars:
 - No engines or propulsion.
 - o No moving weights.
 - Wheel can be attached to the car in any manner, but must not extend beyond the front of the valve cover.
 - o Nothing can extend beyond the front of the valve cover.
 - Cars shall be based on an actual rocker cover from a British <u>automobile</u> engine.
 - o Cars must have four wheels, each no more than six inches in diameter.
 - Wheel must have a non-metallic surface contacting the track.
- Critical Dimensions:
 - o 30-inch maximum overall car length.
 - o 15-inch maximum overall car width.
 - o 10-inch maximum overall car height.
 - o 10 pounds maximum weight by official scales.
 - The front of the car should have a contact point approximately 2 1/2" high.

Track Dimensions

- The Course:
 - The course shall consist of a launch incline ten feet long, followed by a level run of sixteen feet – all plywood surfaces.
 - The launch incline shall be divided into two lanes, each 18 inches wide.
 The incline shall be about three feet high at the rearmost part.
 - The official "Starting Line" is two feet from the rear edge of the incline.


Running the Race

- The Races:
 - $\circ~$ Double elimination brackets in heats of two cars each. (Each pair will race in each lane 2 out of 3 if a tie)
 - Cars will advance in "winners" and "losers" brackets, and the final race will be between those two top cars.
 - NOTE: The starting gate is 3.5 inches tall. Racers should have a surface flush with the front of their car approximately 2 ½ to 3" high to contact this metal tab.
 - Individual starting via push buttons by each racer, following an electronic "Christmas Tree" lighting system.
 - The finish line shall be marked sixteen feet from the front edge of the launch incline.











Cleanup on Aisle A by Bob Gordon

My master cylinder had been leaking since I bought my '62 MGA almost two years ago. The brakes worked fine, so I was not in a rush to change it since it didn't seem like a simple replacement. I ordered the parts and decided to tackle the job about 4 weeks ago. The more parts I removed, the more paint damage I found from the corrosive brake fluid!



I ended up having to remove the heater, master cylinder and brackets, the pedals and wiper motor, and then a multitude of wires and cables. Next, scrape and sand the damaged areas, apply POR15 rust repair, and prime and paint the whole firewall shelf and all affected brackets. Finally I flushed the entire brake and clutch system with denatured alcohol and added DOT 5 fluid, which doesn't damage paint in case of any future leaks!

So what started off as a simple project turned into almost four part-time weeks! But it looks and operates better than ever, and feels great to have restored another part of my LBC by myself.
