


Ausin Engines in My Life by "Robbie" Robert Albert Robertson

There is a blessing with age that is measured in decades, not years. A person can look back and see trends that are in the path of life. One of the trends in my life is Austin Engines. I was a wee laddie when my mother took a picture of me in front of her American Bantam. Okay, it may have had an Austin engine or modified Austin design so American Bantam did not have to pay a design fee. But this was my first association with an Austin Engine.





My first sports car was a 1961 Austin Healy 3000. Oh, the sound of that Austin six-cylinder engine was a wonderful intro to British sports cars. My Scottish father said that a passing semi-trailer truck would blow me off the road. On my first road trip was the test. I saw a semi coming toward me on a two-lane road. I braced myself, ready to turn into the blast of wind. When it passed, I got a blast of wind, but my Austin Healy did not move. I laughed. Dad was used to having his big American car buffeted by semis.

I had bought The 1961 by borrowing \$400 from my girlfriend, Marian. After we married in 1967, I did not have to repay her. Then in 1968 when I graduated from college, I wanted to reward myself with a 1968 Austin Healy 3000 Mark 3. Of course, it was not to be, as the United States safety laws outlawed many cars. The search for a good used 1967 Austin Healy started. We found one, and it was just a short distance from the apartment we lived in. We traded in the 1961 and signed the paper just before a college girl who had wrecked her red Austin Healy 3000 came to buy the one we had just bought.



You can see why I married Marian. She is beautiful and could drive a stick shift. We enjoyed this Austin Healy for years until we needed an air-conditioned car, being that we lived in Miami, Florida.

It was around this time that we attended a friend's party, and I mentioned that I wanted to race sports cars. My friend said that at 31 years old and too old to race. I had joined the SCCA in 1969 (I am a Lifetime member now). I attended a Regional Race in West Palm Beach where a driver of an F-Production Austin Healy Sprite said he was quitting. I asked how much he wanted? He said \$800, and I said "Okay." So, the next weekend I went to his house to get my Austin Healy 1275cc Sprite. It came with a homemade trailer. The trailer needed some work, so I took it to Johnny's Trailer Service and Johnny Jr. helped me. My Dad and Johnny Sr. had done business when I was a wee lad. We designed a trailer that had a drop axle and a goose neck hitch that allowed me to load and unload my Sprite without ramps.

The 1275cc Austin engine needed rebuilding as #3 and #4 pistons had holes in them. A new fellow racer friend helped me. We rebuilt the engine using lower compression dish pistons so that I could get through the two Drivers' Schools and two Regional Races to get my Regional License. As I was preparing the 1 ¼" SU carbs, my friend was pouring oil into the Austin engine. A neighbor was watching him and noticed that oil was coming out of the rear intake port of the head. We agreed that this was not right and found a small hole where the intake had been honed out too much and had broken through to the pushrod channel. I checked with the previous owner, and he told me the machine shop that had worked on the head. They heated up the head and brazed up the hole.



more Ausin Engines in My Life

After getting the Austin engine started, I signed up for my first Drivers' School. We had a Friday night class to go over the flags and other safety procedures. Then the next morning, off to Palm Beach International Raceway where I drove my Austin Healy Sprite for the first time. As I started the second lap, I thought to myself, "Oh, yes I love doing this"! I did two Drivers' Schools and a Regional Race with the 1275 cc Austin Engine preforming flawlessly. Then on the second Regional Race the Austin blew a head gasket. I was very disappointed to say the least. Well, my friend that had helped me rebuild the engine came up to me and said that I could use his 1100cc engine G-Production Austin Healy Sprite in the last race on Saturday night, and if I did well the Regional Executive would sign me off.

During the race his Austin engine would cut out in the turns. He had warned me about this. I noticed that the ignition light would flash, so going down the back straight I reached behind the dashboard and pushed the wiring up against the dashboard. It worked, and I completed the race with the Austin engine running smoothly. Upon reaching the pits after the race, I told him what I had done and fixed it by using needle nose pliers squeezing the solder connection to stop the wire from shorting out. I used connectors in my car. I did well, so the RE signed me off so I could get my Regional License. I had gotten a score of 24 out of 25 on my Drivers' School. After four Regional Races I was able to get my National license.



I raced the Austin Healy Sprite for years tweaking many things to make it faster and handle better. I had to call it an MG Midget 1275cc so that I could modify the body to help cooling and handling. I modified the Austin 1275cc over the years. One item was to use the intake manifold with Healy stamped on them so that I could use MGA 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " SU carbs. I modified the oil pan so that it held seven quarts of oil, and increased the volume of coolant so that my Austin engines ran cool in the hot Florida sun. Down the back straights it would turn 9,200 RPMs. It sounded like a turbine. My Austin engines won two F-Production Championship in 1975 and 79.

How do you pay for racing without hurting the family budget? I rebuild Austin powered sports cars--MGBs, Midgets, and Austin Healy Sprites and 3000s. Okay, there were Triumphs sports cars also. There was a TR6 that a racing friend could not get to run right for the owner. The owner wanted \$1,000.00 for it, so I bought it. I started with the basics and checked the firing order. I found that number 3 and 4 ignition wires were reversed, and it ran like a champ.

I sold it for \$3.500.00 within a month.



At the beginning of the eighties the money from the rebuilds found its way into the family budget and the racing ceased. I still have the race engine that turned 9,200 RPM as a remembrance.

I am rebuilding a 1970 MGB-GT, a 1972 MG Midget that is yellow like the racecar, and I have modified the Austin engine. I have had an

Austin engine in my garage since 1965, including my latest acquisition-a 1959 Morris Minor 1000 I call "Happy," as I have so much fun driving it. Happy has a 948cc Austin engine. Okay, it has a Morris label on it, but it is an ancestor of the engine I remember in my dear mother's American Bantam.

Meanwhile, in Baton Rouge AH Brake Caliper Tech Session April 29th



This morning Rick Huber, Larry and Cathy Kelly, Charlie Brown, Robb Cowzer, Randy Fleming, Roy Johnson and I met Lorraine McCaa at her home to replace the front brake calipers on her Austin Healey 3000. Apparently, someone had sprayed a chemical into the pistons (to free them up?) which reacted with the rubber seals and caused them to swell up enough to lock up one side!

Rick and Robb were the main mechanics with some of us jumping in from time to time. Larry had to walk home to try and get a frozen brake fitting out of a caliper, but it was too far gone. Fortunately, Charlie had a new one and drove home to get it while we visited.

Then, we all got a primer on bending said line to match the old one! In the process, my cheap-o socket wrench broke and almost sent Rick's face through the fender! Think I'm going to splurge on some good quality socket sets for all of my cars. When you need them for an emergency on the side of the road they better be up to the task!

BR C&C May 3rd

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
