He showed us his broken rotor and explained how one of the needles in his carb "fell out" and clogged the jet! Happened once before 15 years ago so that tipped him off. There is a set screw that holds it on the piston...

I showed everyone how to make a "restoration folder" with clear pages, photos and comments to display with their car at shows. I made one with photos of what my car looked like when I bought it. Yuck! You can also get Shutterfly to make a more professional looking book.

We talked about the club crawfish boil, the Gerry Lane Car Show and upcoming Goodwood Hardware show. Chris Savoy wants us to head his way after breakfast on August 28th to see his house and Vespa, then go by his favorite coffee shop and the antique toy store. If you missed this outing last time, it's a nice drive to French Settlement. More on this later.

And finally, Rob was telling us that in addition to "Bobby" Bobby next year we need a "One Man Band." He said that is a very big thing in England. Danny?

British Distributor Rotor Breakage Explained

At our BMCNO Baton Rouge meeting we spit-balled why the inside centering peg on Rick's AH3000 rotor broke. And he mentioned that when he put the electronic conversion on his distributor, the magnetic pickup stuck up too far to fully seat the rotor. This creates a problem with the contact part being too high inside the cap where it spins by the spark plug leads.

When his car had 1/2 power in Branson, Rick twisted the rotor to check the advance spring function - and since only half the centering peg was catching on the shaft, it simply snapped off.

Solution: If you are running an electronic conversion, or the base of your rotor is hitting something on the distributor - check to make sure it is fully seated! Sanding down the bottom of the rotor on a flat surface should fix it. In addition - run a good quality rotor! —Roving Reporter

Benny started our meeting with photos of hybridized British cars—a Jaguar Traveller, a Rolls-Royce truck, TR7 shooting brake, a tartan wrapped Jag and a fuchsia Mini. Then we saw the smallest British car ever made. It's a Peel P50, originally made in the early '60s, and production started again in 2010. It holds the Guinness record as the smallest production car ever made. It doesn't have a reverse gear, but has a handy handle on the back so you can pick it up and move it! We went over all the club events coming up and Colin gave us an update on club business. He encouraged us to consider a Board of Directors position with elections coming up in October. Then we saw photos of and talked about recent activities, our visit to the Big Easy Wing, the TerraBella car show in Covington and the Vicari Auction in Biloxi. —Meandering Muckraker

Distinguished Gentleman's Drive is a world-wide men's health fundraiser featuring classic cars and dapper fashion. DGR and its fundraising partner, Movember Foundation, have raised over \$7.3 million for prostate cancer, men's mental health, and men's suicide prevention. We have now participated in three DGD events and plan to continue doing so as long as we are able.

On September 28, 2025 thousands of drivers in over 150 countries and 1,000 cities will dress their best before taking to the streets in a spectacular display of classic motoring and fashion. Michele and I, along with BMCNO club member and New Orleans drive host Jorge' Menes would like to invite all club members to participate in this year's event!

Registration for Distinguished Gentleman's Drive 2025 will kick off about the time you read this. Simply visit gentlemansdrive.com, hit the registration tab, then locate and select the New Orleans Drive. From there, you will be able to start your own fundraising team similar to a typical Relay for Life fundraiser. We are asking each participant to raise \$150 for the cause through the DGD website. Our goal for the 2024 New Orleans Drive is \$20,000.

Each city that hosts a drive adds its own unique local flavor, and New Orleans is no exception. In fact, New Orleans boasts an entire DGD weekend! A typical New Orleans DGD weekend looks like this:

Friday 5 to 10 p.m. Driver's meet and greet hosted by St. Garage on St. Ferdinand St. in New Orleans. Free food, drinks, and fellowship with other participants and classic car owners.

Saturday 10 a.m. till We have partnered with Deadbeat Brewing Company in Hammond for an afternoon of brews and waterfront fellowship. All drivers registered for DGD are encouraged to drive their classic and receive 20% off wristbands for the afternoon. Hungry for lunch? Blackened Brew next door serves up incredible pub fare! Participants driving in from New Orleans can group up with Jorge' Menes at (504)451-7960. Groups coming in from Baton Rouge can follow Chris Savoy (225) 287 4525. Those riding in from the Northshore can link up with Colin McCormick (985) 264 3448.

Sunday 9 a.m. Drivers gather at the tricentennial parking lot at Café' Du Monde in City Park. Enjoy coffee and beignets before the drive.

Sunday 10:30 a.m. Awards are handed out for Best Dressed and Most Funds Raised.

Sunday 11 a.m. Disembark under Police escort for a parade-style ride through the historical streets of New Orleans!

The Show Did Go Ahead at Covington 2025

A week prior to the BMCNO's car show all the local weather channels were predicting heavy thunderstorms rolling in throughout the day of the show. Organizing any large outdoor event requires months of prior planning and coordination with the local authorities and any thoughts of rescheduling may not be possible. The British Motoring Club New Orleans had decided that this would be a rain or shine event and indeed the weather turned out to be perfect, just a little overcast and slight breeze made for a pleasant event.

Once again, the quaint streets surrounding the Covington Trailhead Visitors Center echoed to the familiar sound of our much-loved British classics as they maneuvered into their allocated parking areas. Understandably the numbers were down, yet a great cross section of makes and models were on display with owners eager to discuss and show different features of their particular cars.

One reason to attend other British Club annual shows is a chance to see some less common cars. When will you see a 1964 Gordon Keeble GK1, one of only 99 produced or a 1963 Jensen CV8, perhaps a 1973 Jensen Interceptor Mk 3 (photo right) would be more to your fancy? Now at the other end of the spectrum was an original Mini chopped and shortened; it looked like a "Noddy Car" but drew a lot of attention.

Quite a few had a typed note on the windscreen indicating that the car was "visitor friendly" allowing



children and adults to have a photo taken sitting in the car. I thought this was a marvelous way of generating interest and making the show more family-oriented. SABCC-er Bob Zabzdyr (photo below) did a roaring trade throughout the day as attendees couldn't resist the chance to have their photo taken in his ubiquitous London Taxi.

Interestingly the organizers decided this would be a judged event and entrants who wish to be judged were to have the bonnet of their car open.

Having attended several out-of-state shows over this past couple of years I noticed that valve cover racing appears to be making a comeback, having been in the doldrums for some time. The New Orleans folks have built a very nice ramp and the run off is also longer, which I feel makes for better racing and the viewing public seemed to enjoy seeing their favorite for a few seconds longer. They also gave kids an opportunity to try their skills, which was wonderful.
