July 16th *Mandeville Meeting*

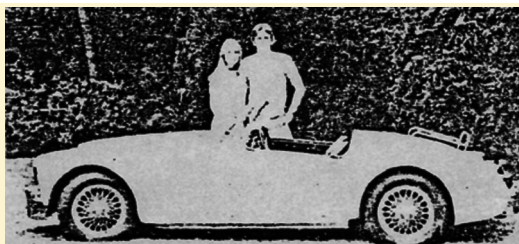

From our February, 1987 Morris Gazette Newsletter

The Club was started in April of 1977 by Eldridge E. Reynolds and his wife Diana. Eldridge was an MG "Fanatic". He would chase MG's to find out more about the car and it's owner. He had an MGA - fully restored but no one in the club ever saw it. He kept it stored at his mother's house in North Louisiana. Diana did drive a white 1965 MGB. At the time the club was formed Eldridge and Diana were living in the Vineyards apts. and the club held its first few meetings there. Eldridge and Diana moved to North Louisiana in Oct. or Nov. of 1977 and soon after the club began meeting at Pepperoni's Pizza Parlor. (After Eldridge left Jack Kennedy took his place as "MG chaser"). In the summer of 1977 Eldridge approached John about joining the club and Jack Kennedy came to our door in the pouring rain to see if we would be interested in joining. Without this kind of enthusiasm I wonder if we would still be in existence today.

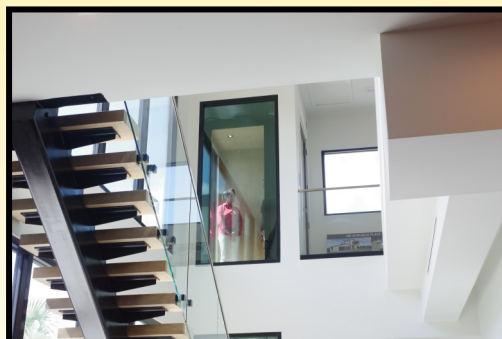

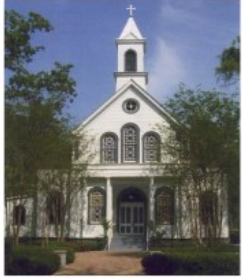

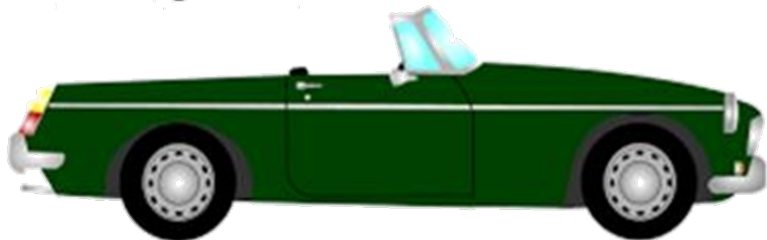
